

Who Do You Say That I Am?

A very devout woman's adult godchild had fallen away from the practice of the faith. This godchild still believed in God, and even felt a sense of belonging in the Church. He was a good and kind person. But poor catechesis and a society that confuses pleasure with joy had left him lax in practice, without an appreciation of the sacraments. He was making choices that threatened his soul.

She was going to ask him the question Jesus poses to Peter in Matthew 16:15 — the critical question in all our lives, the question whose answer will define what we become in this world and the next. Let our whole lives be our answer.

CONTEMPLATE

Isn't it a bit weird that Catholics call the Pope "papa," father? This Sunday provides us with essential Scriptural background on the papacy, the petrine office. Jesus gives Peter the "keys to the kingdom of heaven," after witnessing to the special grace Peter has to know Jesus' true identity. Many have pointed out that the "keys" refer back to the figure of Eliakim, King David's prime minister. True enough. But notice this is not mere authority or power. It's a family relationship. The Lord says to Eliakim, "He shall be a father to the inhabitants of Jerusalem" (Isaiah 22:21). David's prime minister was a spiritual father to the family of Israel. Peter, and his successors, will be spiritual fathers in the family of the Church.

This means we have a serious obligation to not only recognize the Pope's authority, but also to love him with the affection of children for their papa. We should never speak about him with disrespect or rancor. We should listen to him with trusting hearts, and ignore the slander thrown at him in various media. When we show the world we are loving and obedient to our Holy Papa, perhaps they'll see more clearly that the Church is indeed God's beloved family. — Father John Muir



Maintaining Our Parish Buildings

It is always a blessing to have leaders with foresight – leaders who can predict and prepare for the future. Some twenty-five years ago, our parish was blessed with such a great leader as Father Denis Kohlrus, who knew so well that our parish church building and

rectory would need some maintenance in a couple of decades. To prepare for this maintenance, he campaigned for some money and saved enough for such maintenance when the time came.

Now is the time. Our church building is falling apart. When I arrived at St. Thomas last year, our then-maintenance manager, Vern Wilson, quickly called my attention to the roof of the church building, which was fast falling apart. Knowing too well it is not my

expertise, I quickly formed a new committee to help make a thorough study of our parish buildings and grounds. This committee, led by Paul Wayne and Dave Hillyer, has taken enough time to study our parish church's facilities. They have submitted their studies, recommendations, and bids from different companies to repair the roof of the church building and carry out some masonry repairs for both the church building and the rectory.

After studying these recommendations and bids, the parish finance council has asked me to request permission from the diocese to let us embark on these repairs before the buildings get even worse. I have submitted this request and hope to hear from the diocese in the next few weeks.

We hope to have these repairs done and our church building and rectory in good shape. We also need to be grateful to the late Father Denis Kohlrus and the St. Thomas congregation of his time for being such great stewards of the blessings of God in their lives. Without such excellent stewardship that they exemplified by saving such money, we may not be able to make these repairs that will now cost almost two hundred thousand dollars.

Where do we go from here?

We need to replace this money. We need to prepare the future generation of our dear parish like Father Kohlrus, whose congregation prepared it for us. Please consider donating specifically for "parish maintenance" to St. Thomas the Apostle Church. Also, it will be an incredible act of faith and charity to include St. Thomas the Apostle Church in your will. Without our generous stewardship of God's blessings, we may deprive future generations of a church called "St Thomas the Apostle" here in Decatur.

May God continue to bless and replenish our pockets as we consider this heartfelt request to keep our parish open and alive.


