

Isn't it easy to relate to Peter? One moment Jesus announces Peter's deep communion with God the Father. The very next, when he rejects the logic of Jesus' suffering and death, Jesus calls Peter Satan. We Christians shouldn't be too shocked when we experience both spiritual highs and lows, when we perceive breathtaking contradictions in our hearts.

Like the great apostle, you and I are recipients of unfathomable graces. God dwells in us, calls his beloved children, and takes care of our every need. And we also continually fail to embrace our sufferings with trust in Jesus. We know the truth of the creed, but we easily scorn the weight of the cross.

The good news is that, like Peter, we are never abandoned by the Lord even at our worst moments. Peter will eventually learn the beauty of the cross when he is willingly crucified. But it took time for him to get there. And it takes time for us, too. This week let's not be too shocked at these divisions in our hearts but accept them and patiently seek to be more obedient to Jesus' cross-shaped plan for us.

Mass Intentions

Offering every Mass for a particular intention is a sacramental spiritual practice with a long history in the Catholic Church. Knowing that the Eucharistic celebration is the greatest of all spiritual sacrifices

under heaven, the Church rightly provides that each Mass is offered for a particular intention. This way, the faithful can offer this noble sacrifice for their family and loved ones and other causes and people dear to them.

In practice, offering the Holy Mass for a particular intention has been widely understood as exclusively for people who have died. Because of how widespread this practice has become, many young people now think Masses are offered only for the dead.

Recently, during a Mass at a church in Springfield, a young child heard my name mentioned for the Mass intention. Confused, she furiously asked her mom if Father Peter was dead. The mother was shocked and said no. She tried to explain to her daughter that Masses can be offered to anyone – living or dead. But it would take the young girl a lunch visit with her parents over here with me a few days later to be convinced I was not dead.

Unfortunately, even many of our adults somehow think that Masses are offered only for dead people. The simple reason behind this idea is the wrong practice that has become a tradition for many of us. We do not request Mass for our family and friends until they die. While this practice is wrong, it also alters the traditional teachings of the Church that Masses can be offered for both the living and the dead and any worthy causes dear to the faithful.

Let us learn to request Masses for ourselves, our family, and loved ones, and for causes we care about. The Holy Mass is the highest form of spiritual sacrifice on earth. Offering the Eucharistic sacrifice for someone or something is a beautiful way to express our love for people and approval of noble causes.

One can request a Mass for \$10.00 or more here in our diocese of Springfield in Illinois. As good members and friends of St. Thomas the Apostle Church, we achieve two spiritual goods when we request Masses

for ourselves, our loved ones, and for any causes. First, we support our parish sacramental life. Second, we realize the spiritual benefit of receiving the abundant graces that flow from the Eucharistic sacrifice of the Mass.


