The History of the Rosary

The origins of the Rosary are "sketchy" at best. The use of "prayer beads" and the repeated recitation of prayers to aid in meditation stem from the earliest days of the Church and has roots in pre-Christian times. Evidence exists from the Middle Ages that strings of beads were used to count Our Fathers and Hail Marys. Actually, these strings of beads became known as "Paternosters," the Latin for "Our Father."

The structure of the Rosary gradually evolved between the 12th and 15th centuries. Eventually 50 Hail Marys were recited and linked with verses of psalms or other phrases evoking the lives of Jesus and Mary. During the 16th century, the structure of the five-decade Rosary based on the 3 sets of mysteries prevailed.

CONTEMPLATE

A life-long Catholic friend of mine recently mumbled to me, "I can't stand all these converts to the faith. They're always rocking the boat." It made me realize how easily I close my heart to those whom I perceive to be outsiders who become new members of the Catholic community.

This week Jesus' punchy parable about the two sons blows up that black and white world. One son said he wouldn't get to work, and then did. The other said he would, and then he did not. "Which did the will of his father?" asks the Lord. Like so many of us, in identifying the first as the answer, the religious authorities manifest hidden hypocrisy in refusing to follow Jesus. They — like us — intuit the correct path but simply won't do it. The tax collectors and prostitutes are indeed following Jesus and thereby getting to work in the kingdom of God. Everyone is called to do God's will regardless of the labels we may apply to them.

This week let's reject the convenient but damaging categories of "insiders" and "outsiders." Instead, let's embrace a grateful attitude that Jesus is calling fallen, weak, and broken men and women like you and me. Then we begin to see that the tax collectors and prostitutes aren't them. They are us. And Jesus wants all of us working in his boat, no matter the rocking.

Herbert Dulle - and the Angels

Last Friday, September 29th, was the feast of the archangels – Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael. While we know of the existence of multitudes of angels in heaven and those assigned to each of us as our guardian angels, only a few,

Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael, are explicitly named in the Bible; Lucifer, who disobeyed God, was condemned to hell. All the angels, including the three archangels, have specific functions besides their overall duty of constantly singing praises to God in heaven. Archangel Michael is generally known for his military role as the

defender of the children of God against their enemies. He appears in the Book of Daniel as the great prince who defends Israel against its enemies and in the Book of Revelation as leading God's armies to final victory over the forces of evil (cf. iBreviary). Archangel Gabriel is mainly known as God's messenger who has conveyed most of the prominent events in our salvation history to persons whom God used as the instruments of establishing his will on earth. We read about him mostly in the Book of Daniel and the Gospel of Luke. Finally, the Archangel Raphael appears predominantly in the Book of Tobit, conveying God's love and goodness to Tobias.

Here on earth, we have our guardian angels for special spiritual support daily. In addition, God has given us a unique ability to be angels to other people – angels of protection, provision, prayerful supports, hospitality, love, and so on.

When I first arrived in the United States to study in the seminary for our Diocese of Springfield, the couple Herbert and Helen Dulle volunteered to be angels of hospitality to me. This couple showered me with so much love and hospitality that I was hardly homesick all my years in the seminary in Indiana. They were there for me in any way a parent can be of loving support to their children.

A year ago, on September 29, 2022, on the feast of the angels, Herb died. There could be no better proof of who he has been to me than joining the saints on the feast of the angels for which he officially became one. His death left a terrible scar on my life as I lost a Dad and a friend in him. Herbert was a perfect Dad, friend, and an angel in human form alongside his wife. They will forever have a special place in my life and priesthood. To commemorate this year's feast of the angels, I ask for one Hail Mary prayer for Herb Dulle's soul and the souls of the faithful who were angels of hospitality, love, and endless support to others while they were here with us.





"... I suggest for us Catholics that we turn to our Blessed Mother for her intercession by praying the Rosary. Many parishioners pray the Rosary together in church before Mass, a practice that I heartily encourage. Prior to the naval battle of Lepanto to repulse the westward expansion into Europe by the Ottoman Turks in the 16th century, Pope St. Pius V called on Catholics to pray the Rosary. After the battle was successfully won near the west coast of Greece on Oct. 7, 1571, the pope attributed the victory to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary and declared the Feast Day of Our Lady of Victory, which we now observe as Our Lady of the Rosary each year on Oct. 7. Let us pray to the Queen of Peace for her intercession, that the whole world may be led to the peace promised by her son, Jesus, the Prince of Peace." — 10/19/14

"During one of my training runs, after I finished praying the Rosary, I kept holding the Rosary in my hand with the cross of the Rosary between my index finger and my thumb. I felt the Lord say to me, 'Hold fast to the cross. Embrace the pain.' During the last few miles of the Long Beach Marathon I kept repeating that to myself like a mantra: 'Hold fast to the cross. Embrace the pain.'

Oct. 7 is the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. While running the marathon, I prayed over 200 Hail Marys while meditating on the Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful, and Glorious Mysteries.
