## TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### Today's Scriptures

**The inner word:** *What's in your heart?*

God treats you as sons," the Letter to the Hebrews says: in contemporary language, "children of God." That's a big challenge. It doesn't mean being small or dependent. Rather, it involves becoming like *the* Son of God, accepting the responsibility of enduring "your trials" as he did his. Hebrews calls that "discipline" and acknowledges that while discipline "seems a cause not for joy but for pain," discipleship—the way of discipline—accepts the possibility of suffering for a higher purpose: following Jesus. Where do you find this "discipline" in your life?

### Salvation made simple

My friend Teresa is dying, and it's a hard time for her, as final illnesses usually are. Eternal rewards don't interest her at this time of her life, and indeed haven't since childhood. Her parents told Teresa then, and she still believes now, that only 144,000 people merit salvation, as it says in the Book of Revelation. "I'm not one of them, so it doesn't matter what I do," she says patiently, having made peace with her flawed self a long time ago. Teresa's no saint, and honestly feels more comfortable in the doomed sinner category. Let the 144,000 have their reserved bleached white celestial garments! she will make do with whatever awaits the rest of us.

So let's begin with a correction: Revelation doesn't say 144,000 merit saving. It says uncountable multitudes do, underscoring this assessment with a number signifying completeness. Twelve represents all Israel, and also the 12 apostles or the ingathered New Israel of the church. Twelve times 12 is 144, which has a superlative effect in numerology. Think of the three zeros like ellipsis dots . . . as if to say this number goes on and on. Far from a limiting tally, the 144,000 predicts a vast ocean of rescued souls.

Still, people continue to wonder as the disciples do: "Will only a few be saved?" In Luke's gospel, where followers are advised to give their possessions away and consider anger a form of murder and lust a prelude to adultery, perdition seems all but inevitable. Jesus seems to agree when he recommends the narrow gate.

Or does he? A quick comparison between the gospel and first reading reveals that Jesus is working from a well-known text about the broad *inclusion* that defines God's saving plan. Isaiah not only predicts that foreign nations will come to see God's glory. He also says foreigners will be eligible for Israel's priesthood as well! Priests, remember, belonged to the tribe of Levi, the tribe claiming Moses, Aaron, and Miriam among its ancestors. Other Israelites could not exercise priestly functions—and now God is going to select priests from outside Israel? It was an audacious prophecy in the time of Trito-Isaiah (sixth century B.C.E.) and had lost none of its shock-value in the generation of Jesus.

By no means, then, is Jesus narrowing the gene pool of the saved by this teaching. Rather he's saying divine rescue comes more easily to the outsider (presumed damned) than to the insider (presumed saved). My dying friend Teresa, in her humility and lack of religious pretension, has a better shot at claiming one of those white robes than I do as a professional religionist. If I want to stand with her one day in eternity, I have to find the narrow gate, lose a few dozen pounds of self-righteousness, and edge my way inside.

### Questions Catholics ask

#### WHO WAS SAINT AUGUSTINE?

YOU MADE us for yourself, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You." The man we know as Augustine of Hippo (feast day August 28) made this passionate declaration to God in his *Confessions* written in Africa in the fourth century. A prolific writer and even more famous orator, this impassioned thinker and Christian convert wrote some of the earliest extended scripture commentaries. He left an indelible mark on teachings concerning baptism, original sin, chastity, and doctrines about Jesus as well. He chased suspicious ideas around the church tirelessly and defined orthodoxy on many issues.

For a lot of folks, however, Augustine fascinates as a person: Sexual desire and intellectual craving for knowledge were the twin demons of his life. His restless heart found repose in the mystery of God reluctantly—but not without a considerable struggle that he chose to document personally for us.

The man who would become Saint Augustine was once a faithless lover, an unreliable dad, a lousy prospect for a husband, and a guy who regularly broke his mother's heart. That he also became an irreplaceable paving stone in church thought is wonderfully encouraging for all of us who currently fall short of who we might yet be.

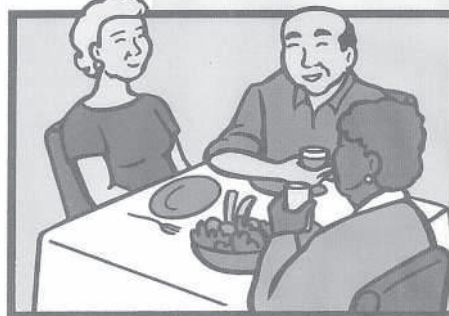
