From the Desk of Father Haan...

Loving with a Motherly Heart

A blessed Mother's Day to all who show us a mother's love. In reflecting on their early years of parenting, so many couples have told me, "You know, Father, parenting doesn't come with an instructional manual!" Yes, parenting with grace is a tremendous challenge, but it makes all the difference in the world when you have experienced wonderful, heroic, faith-filled, and loving examples to be inspired by and to emulate. It could be your own mother, grandmother, aunt, or a neighbor. Hopefully our Blessed Mother Mary has inspired you! Let me introduce you to six more phenomenal women who, by God's grace, lived their motherhood heroically.



St. Teresa of Calcutta: No, she didn't have any biological children, but she is an important example of a preeminent dimension of motherly love: *spiritual motherhood*. She cared for those who had been forsaken or abandoned by their own mothers and provided for their spiritual, emotional, and physical needs. She reminded us that the worst form of poverty "is not only a poverty of loneliness but also of spirituality. There's a hunger for love, as there is a hunger for God." Even though she is canonized, there is a reason we still like to call her *Mother Teresa*!

Saint Elizabeth: She was the cousin of Our Lady and the mother of Saint John the Baptist. She and her husband, Zechariah, were "both righteous in the eyes of God, observing all the commandments and ordinances of the Lord blamelessly" (Lk 1:6). Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit when Mary (and the prenatal Christ) came and visited her. She raised John the Baptist to prepare the way of the Lord, and to recognize the Messiah when He came. A task for every mother!

Saint Monica: In his autobiographical classic *Confessions*, Saint Augustine attributed his conversion to the powerful and persevering prayers and tears of his mother, Saint Monica. He wrote, "I cannot communicate clearly enough what love she had for me, and how with greater anguish she brought me forth in spirit than she had given me birth in the flesh." Motherly prayer is powerful!

Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton: She was first a wife and mother of five children, then later a widow and a consecrated religious sister and foundress. She is known for her role in starting Catholic parochial schools in America. Her motherhood was lived in forming and educating young souls to fall in love with God.

Saint Zelig Martin: She is best known as the mother of Saint Therese of Lisieux, but all five of her daughters entered religious life. She was canonized in 2015 with her husband, Louis. In pursuing a holy marriage, she was able to live her motherhood with grace and keep her children's eyes on Christ.

Saint Gianna Beretta Molla: Trained as a medical doctor specializing in pediatrics, Saint Gianna's pregnancy with her fourth child was complicated by a fibroma tumor. Faced with the choice between risking her own life and saving her child's, she heroically chose to honor the life of her child. Saint Gianna gave birth to a healthy child but died in the days that followed. Like so many mothers, she lived a heroic, self-sacrificial love for her children.

Updated Mass Protocols at St. Louis de Montfort Catholic Church

Especially in the last couple of months, we at St. Louis de Montfort have experienced increased numbers at many of our weekend Masses. This is a tremendous blessing and a joy to have so many return to Mass, but added numbers brings challenges regarding pandemic protocols.

People hold a wide range of opinions on this topic, and our prayer is that charity, patience, and parish unity in our Catholic faith will prevail. As leaders of the parish, our priority is to provide access to the Sacraments of the Church while providing a context for your health and safety. We want people to pray well and worship God. We also want to care for one another.

Our prayer is that COVID numbers will continue to plummet and soon lead to a freedom from any needed protocols. But the virus is still around, and we must take into account the factors of distance, time, and masking in the spread of the disease.

The following applies to the 5pm Saturday Vigil Mass, the 9am Sunday Mass, and the 11:30am Sunday Mass:

- We will begin using every pew for seating, only requiring three feet of social distancing between families. Masks will still be expected.

The 7:30am Sunday Mass and the 5pm Sunday Mass will still be every other pew and masks will still be expected.

We all have a responsibility to the community. So that means if you are experiencing COVID-like symptoms, please remain home.

As of now, our diocese has not adjusted its music protocols. We are hopeful that congregational singing will return soon, but this means for now that singing is still reserved to the cantor and the celebrant of Mass.

Please stay tuned to email, the bulletin, website, and social media as protocols may shift as we learn more and as the diocese provides further directives.

We are glad that you are here! Please keep praying for parish unity, patience, and charity.

Pastoral Vision Planning for each pastorate is an integral part of Uniting in Heart 2030. Currently, there are 4 pastorates going through a pilot phase of the vision planning process with Our Sunday Visitor,

in which they have begun to develop their 3-Year Rolling Pastoral Plans. The process begins when a formal pastoral council has been formed, and a pastorate survey of all parishioners has been conducted. The survey inventories parishioner's experiences related to the following categories: Parish COVID-19 Response; Uniting in Heart; Spirituality and Pastoral Response; Communication; Ministries, Service, Hospitality, and Evangelization; Stewardship of Treasure; The Faith Life of You and Your Family; and the Future of our Pastorate. After the survey responses have been collated, the team spends time in prayer and reflection and through the power of the Holy Spirit, discerns what areas need the most focus in the pastorate. Using the guidance and resources provided in the Uniting in Heart Pastorate Guide, the pastorate leadership

team, pastoral council, financial council(s) representative(s), and pastorate consultant hold meetings with a coach from OSV to develop the goals and benchmarks that they discern are appropriate for their pastorate over the next three years. When goals are well defined with measurable metrics that can be shared, the plan is put into a formal Pastorate Vision Plan brochure that is tailored to the specific pastorate and shared with parishioners. This allows the whole pastorate community to understand, acknowledge and ultimately participate in executing and meeting the goals set by the pastorate. 




