From the Desk of Father Haan

Be a Prospector

I can't tell you how many times I've met people who, when introducing themselves, say, "I was raised Catholic." The implication is that they are no longer Catholic, or not practicing. If I probe a bit, people cite a variety of reasons. But one common thread can be found in many of them. One person spoke of a priest who was mean to them in confession twenty years ago. Another talked about the boring homilies of the parish priest of their childhood. One person referenced the weakness and cowardice of the US bishops. One woman gave up going to Mass out of frustration with Pope Francis.

The common thread in all of these, of course, is the disconcerting *human dimension of the Church*. That people leave the Church because of its humanity should not be surprising to us- didn't people leave Jesus because his humanity was unimpressive? ("Is he not the carpenter's son?" (Mt 13:55) "Can anything good come from Nazareth?" (Jn 1:46)).

In reality, people should not be scandalized that the Church is made up of weak and imperfect human instruments, because the Church has never claimed to be anything otherwise. This is the marvel of God's wisdom ("God chose the foolish of the world to shame the wise, and God chose the weak of the world to shame the strong" (1 Cor 1:27)). Didn't Christ choose twelve weak human instruments as apostles? Father Luigi Giussani, an Italian priest and theologian who founded the movement "Communion and Liberation," writes beautifully on this topic in his book, Why the Church?

"The Church's most specific claim is not just that it is the vehicle of the divine, but that this vehicle works through human reality...If we recognize that this is the Church's definition of itself, then no objection to Christianity that makes a point or pretext of the disproportion, inadequacy or error of the human reality which forms the Church, can ever logically be made."

But this insight is not merely applied to those who leave the Church, but for all of us who still get frustrated with individual priests, deacons, bishops, or popes. How do we overlook the weaknesses and imperfections that are so prevalent and obvious and not get discouraged? Giussani writes,

"In effect, an individual must possess a profound desire for truth in order to overcome the scandal of the instrument communicating it... A gold prospector would never have been daunted by the mud of the river bed where he hoped to find nuggets. Rather, he would have been motivated by the probability of finding gold, not by the conditions he might have to face in order to come across it... It is the responsibility of each one of us to desire the gold of the message. If one truly desires gold, then he is not scandalized at finding it in mud. He must dirty his hands and work hard to extract it. But if one does not want to get his hands dirty, then he is not all that interested in the gold after all; he is more concerned about keeping his hands clean."



That means each of us must have the disposition of such a desire and love for the Truth of Christ that we are willing to overlook a priest's annoying habits or imperfections to find the gold of the Truth which serves to transform us. Let's not be shocked by the mud! Giussani notes, "Saint Francis of Assisi was not shocked at the divisions and violence shaking the foundations of the Church in his time...neither was Catherine of Siena, over a century after Francis' death, shocked at the wretched situation into which the Church had sunk." Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen made the observation, "those who flee the Church because of the hypocrisy and imperfection of the religious individuals in it, forget that if the Church were as perfect as they would like it to be, then there would be no place for them at all."

In the end, fragile humanity is not a scandal, but rather the vehicle which Christ uses to reveal "the sublimity of a power, the invincibility of a presence" that comes not from us but which uses us, "and which has begun, irresistibly, to change the world."


