

Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

Recently, the Congress of the United States took up several initiatives that are of great concern to Catholics, including the recently proposed "Equality Act." It is a threatening piece of legislation that could negatively impact the common good of citizens and religious liberties in our nation.

Bishop Ricken encourages everyone in the diocese to educate themselves and defend the faith by weighing in on proposed legislation entitled "The Equality Act." Below are several points about how this impacts the dignity of the human person through the lens of Catholic social teaching.

- The purpose of the Equality Act is to protect people experiencing same-sex attraction and gender discordance from unjust discrimination, which is a worthy purpose.
- However, the bill would require people of faith to accept as true teachings about gender and sexual orientation that go against their deeply-held religious convictions.
- The Equality Act, therefore, poses a threat to the church's religious freedom and undermines the Christian understanding of the human person.
- The Catholic Church is the largest non-governmental human service provider in the United States, helping millions of Americans in need through its parishes, schools, hospitals, shelters, legal clinics, food banks and charities. It is our core beliefs about the human person that motivate us to take action in service to the human person. The Equality Act would undermine our ability to continue to serve by requiring the Church to deny these core beliefs.
- For this reason, we oppose this legislation.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Anyone familiar with gardening knows that proper and timely pruning is essential. The health of the plant depends upon it. An unpruned tree can quickly produce suckers that zap many of the essential nutrients from its body. Pruning requires patience and vision. Studies reveal that plants often respond defensively to being pruned, displaying reactions that are similar to hurt or discomfort. Pruning is not easy but necessary. A hard lesson for us to learn is that we also need to be pruned. We become far healthier when we allow God to stretch, refine, and form us into the best version of ourselves. The fruit that then comes from our vines will be more abundant, nutritious, and robust. Left to our own devices we can easily find ourselves running amuck and spiraling out of control. Without a proper vision and trust in the Master Pruner, we will never find the contentment we desperately desire. Nor will the work of the Gospel stand a chance of succeeding.

In today's Gospel, Jesus identifies himself as the True Vine by using the "I am" statement so common in the Gospel of John. In using the divine name "I am", Jesus reveals His true identity as the one through whom salvation comes, the one equal to the Father. To explain the connection further, John uses the Old Testament allegory of Israel as Yahweh's vine (see Ps 80:9-20) where the growers of a vineyard took care of the healthy growth of the vines. When branches did not yield fruit, they were cut off and dried on the wall of the vineyard to be used later as fuel.

Today's allegory has an intimate tone. Jesus is preparing the Twelve for the mission and reminds them that without Him they can do nothing. They will not find success if they depend on things outside of Him because He is the true vine of which the Father takes personal care. The fruitful branches are and will be the disciples who accept Jesus' life-giving word and remain in Him.

But the message and mission doesn't stop with the Twelve. It is given to us as well. We too must be fruitful. From a vine we look for grapes, and from a Catholic Christian, we look for Christ-like behavior. We must bear fruit by doing good in the world. So as we continue to celebrate the Easter season, how will you stay connected to the True Vine so you can bear fruit?





