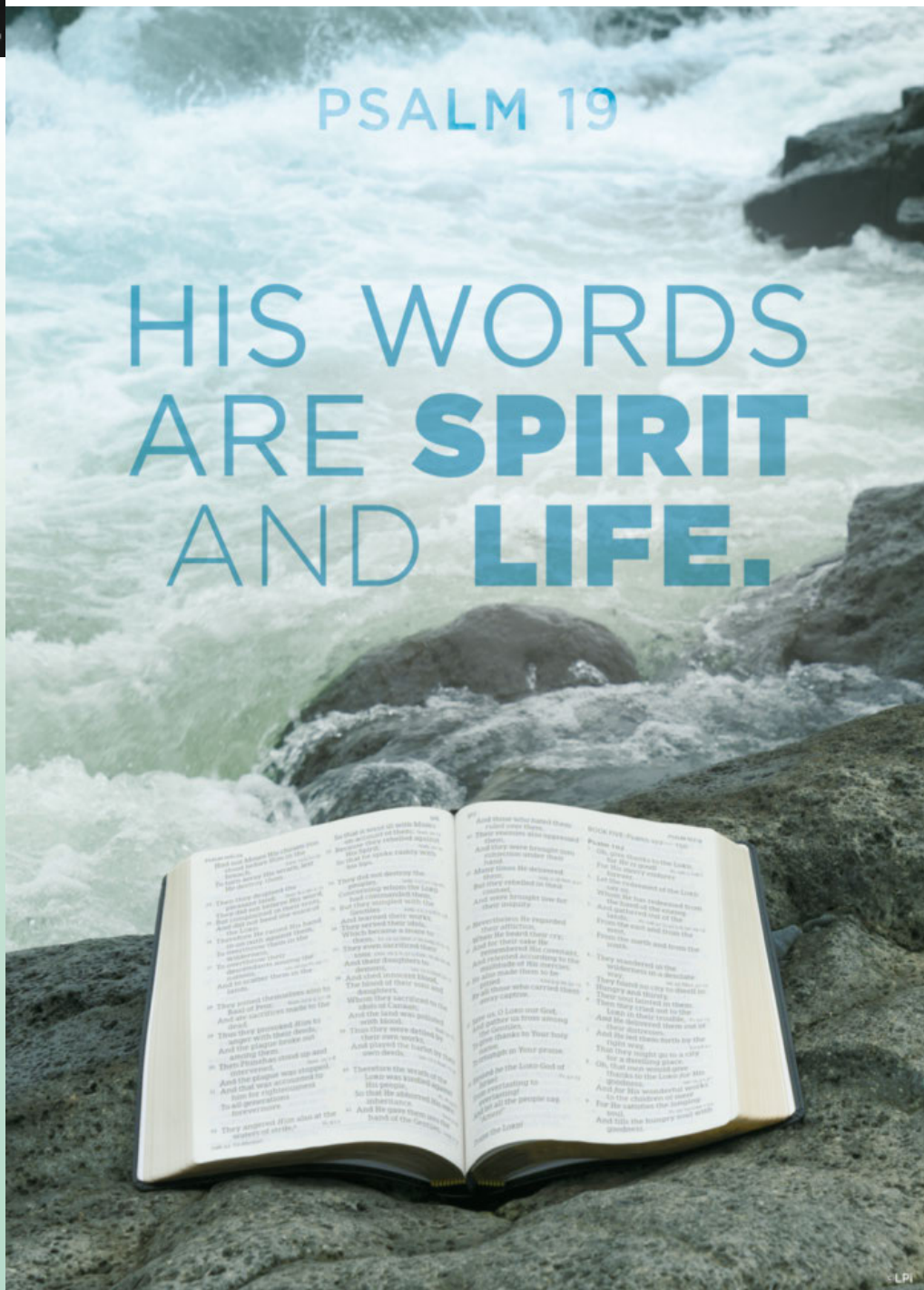

SAINT AGNES

Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

This past week I came across a post from a musician whose music I enjoy. I saw her play a set at Mile of Music in Appleton several years ago and bought some of her albums. She is not well-known but is a very gifted singer and songwriter. The post I saw from her was her expressing her strong beliefs in abortion rights in conjunction with a benefit concert she was playing named Rock for Roe. I wasn't at all surprised to see this, just saddened again. I long ago lost any expectation that the artists whose music I enjoy share the same beliefs I have about abortion. I am used to being disappointed in this, another of many pieces of the culture that I don't fit. The argument from her words and others is that no one can know the difficult situation of each individual and so have no right to demand they carry a pregnancy to term. It's true. We don't really know the intimate workings of others' deep worries and fears and their life struggles. And yet still, is the unborn child alive and growing and is it a destruction of boy or girl? The question will persist. That is the reason that still the issue will not go away. I know the culture is more and more persuasive, that it has used an array of ideas and information and sources to persuade people that abortion is necessary, that it is medical care, and totally individual choice. It has become the norm; if you think otherwise you are marginalized as being radical and extreme. That's a strange and dangerous place we have come to on an issue which ought to be clear to see. But you see now that it is often the most defining and divisive political question. Why does this issue seem to override all others? Why can't there be compassion for both, the woman in need and the baby before birth?

This weekend, Saturday the 22nd, is/was the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of the Unborn. We know that this is not just a vital issue in the United States but all around the world.

The Sisters of Life are an order dedicated especially to ministering to the pregnant and committed to witnessing to the value of all life. If our culture really was open and fair in discussion about such a major topic as abortion, and other topics like euthanasia, then why are competent and compelling voices like those of the Sisters of Life never included in the discussion.

They have the following on their website:

We believe every person is valuable and sacred. We believe that every person is good, loved, unique and unrepeatable. We believe that every person's life has deep meaning, purpose and worth. In fact, we give our lives for that truth.

You can go to their website, sistersoflife.org, to read how they think and speak about the issue. Then you will have some better words and ways to talk about it yourself. They have resources there: articles, videos, audios, stories and a YouTube channel where they recently launched an End of Life series.

In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus rises in the temple to read from the Book of Isaiah, where He proclaims that the poor will have glad tidings brought to them, a year of liberty would be proclaimed to the captives, recovery of sight given to the blind, and the oppressed would be set free.

Jesus sits again, and with all eyes in the synagogue intently on Him, says, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing" (Luke 4:21).

We have the specifics outlined in the rest of the Gospels, as we see Jesus walking about performing wonders, healing the ill and proclaiming the coming of the kingdom of God, which He embodies, to rich and poor alike.

But building the kingdom doesn't stop there. St. Paul, speaking in his First Letter to the Corinthians, addresses many of the dimensions of Jesus shared with His people, His body. Paul emphasizes that all of us do not engage in the same manifestations of the Spirit: "The body is not a single part, but many," he says (1 Cor 12:14).

That truth remains to this day in 2022. I see Jesus in those I encounter, and I see various manifestations of the Body of Christ...disciples living their faith. #Godisgood #blessed

This would be a good opportunity to tell of another need we have and that is for 2 couples who can help with Baptism prep. I have four couples and the prep happens once a month so each couple just conducts the prep 3 times a year. It is simple---first Sunday of the month at 6:30 PM, watch Baptism video and have discussion. It is a wonderful way to share in the faith with young couples at the arrival of a new baby.

Note regarding the St. Gabriel Room for Adoration. Some people have requested different chairs that would be more comfortable and better for their back. We will order five chairs like the other single chairs in church but it may take awhile before they are made and delivered. They are not cheap either and this is thanks to a generous parishioner donation. But I would add, it is not possible to find the perfect chair for every person. Also, due to the fact that the St. Gabriel Room is a very multi-use and multi-purpose room, it is necessary to use the plastic chairs primarily so that they can be moved around easily.

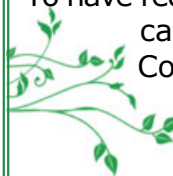
