

SAINT AGNES

Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.





#### 2021 Reading Pt. 3

My favorite novel from last year was *The Remains Of The Day,* the highly acclaimed 1988 book by Kazuo Ishiguro which was made into a film in 1993 with Anthony Hopkins and Emma Thompson. I saw the movie years

ago but did not remember the story. The basic plot could seem to be a rather bland and tedious story- life of an English butler. And in fact for some readers it might not feel like much more. However, Ishiguro reveals the story subtly and so very gradually to open up the very private confines of a man questioning his whole life. Stevens the butler, with a high sense of duty and loyalty, worked in the service of a respectable English lord through and after World War II.






With the years behind him and while seeking to reestablish a relationship with

another former employee of the house, Miss Kenton, a relationship which might have allowed him to feel and be more truly human, Stevens reminisces and realizes the very uncomfortable truth about the man and the house he confidently dedicated most of his life. The author Ishiguro was born in Japan in 1954 but his family moved to Britain in 1960 giving some insight into his crafting this psychological portrait.

Another favorite novel was *The Tiger's Wife* (2011) by Téa Obreht, who similarly has the story of a moving as a child. Born in Belgrade in former

Yugoslavia in 1985, she moved to the United States at age 12. Her much praised and popular debut novel is the story of Natalia, a young doctor in an unspecified Balkan country who is seeking answers to family mysteries rooted in her close relationship with her grandfather and times with him and *The Jungle Book*. Obreht's style has some aspects of magical realism, which is most often associated with Latin American writers such as Gabriel Garcia Marquez. Being new to that type of writing, I am still trying to understand its literary use and intentions. Dreams, memories, and



unexpected visions seem to characterize magical realism. I would like to re-read both Ishiguro's and Obreht's books once again if it were not for others waiting.

Another tiger book, not a novel, was Thomas Howard's *Christ The Tiger* (1967). He wrote: "Christian vision...grasps the actualities of history and existence and transfigures them by seeing beyond the dark borders of finitude and discrepancy, evil and futility, doom and decay to an order that gives depth, substance, and significance to our existence."
