

SAINT AGNES

Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

Penitential Act

In the Introductory Rites of the Mass, after the greeting, Father invites us to take part in an Act of Penitence, which after a brief pause for silence and reflection, the assembly carries out a general confession.

We call to mind our sins and place our trust in God's abiding mercy. This of course, does not replace the need for us to confess our sins individually, but it prepares us to worship God worthily.

In the early Church, this was an opportunity for public penance for sins. Often people did public penance for months or even years. Can you imagine us speaking our sins out loud at this point in the Mass and begging forgiveness? Pretty humbling, I'd say.

After Father greets the congregation, he says, "Let us acknowledge our sins, and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries." The next prayer, often led by the Deacon, if present, can take a few different forms.

We can recite the Confiteor..."I confess to Almighty God, and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned"...we strike our breast three times as we "own" the fault of our sins..."through MY fault, through MY fault, through MY most grievous fault." The physical aspect is penitential in, and of, itself.

We can also use the "Lord have Mercy, Christ have Mercy, Lord have Mercy," prayers with what are called "tropes" between each. These are short phrases that help us keep the perspective of God's mercy. Examples might be..."Lord, you were sent to heal the contrite of heart...you came to call sinners...you are seated at the right hand of the Father to intercede for us." These invocations are addressed to Christ.

Finally the Kyrie, eleison (Greek for "Lord have Mercy") option which is a traditional language dating back to the early Church. I personally love this because it takes us back to the earliest traditions of our Liturgy. It recalls an ancient document, called the Didache which noted that people came together on the Lord's day and gave thanks, "after first confessing their sins."

These prayers can be recited or chanted but they all serve the same purpose of recognizing our sins against God, both communally, and individually. During the Easter season we also have the option of the sprinkling rite, recalling our Baptism and the reconciliation brought about by Christ.

Each of these options conclude with Father's absolution..."may Almighty God have Mercy on us, forgive us our sins and bring us to everlasting life." Amen!

Then...we are ready to pray the rest of the Mass!


