SAINT AGNES

Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

Pro Life Compassion

A few months ago I was asked to do the opening and closing prayer for the closing ceremony of the 40 Days for Life prayer warriors on the sidewalk on Oneida Street, in front of Planned Parenthood.

As I was finishing the opening prayer, a man came charging into the group accompanied by a young girl, presumably his daughter. He was loud, profane and rude...yelling every "bumper sticker" slogan those of us on the sidewalk have heard for years (nothing new under the sun!). His main point seemed to be that none of those present actually care for babies...especially after they're born.

Of course, he wouldn't know that because in attendance were victims of abortion, adoptive parents, adopted children, pediatric doctors and nurses and numerous others who have given so much to help young mothers and their babies over many years. All these people wanted to do on this day was to pray.

The angry man wanted to share his anger. Who knows the full source of it but based on the social media evidence, he carries at least some post abortive anger...sadly on full display in front of his little girl.

The group spontaneously prayed the Rosary and a couple men took him aside to try to reason with him and calm him down. He ranted for a while longer and finally left.

There was video evidence of his aggressive behavior toward the group and the authorities were contacted. Charges were pressed and last week he was brought before a judge, found guilty, lectured and fined a significant amount that, based on his comment, would be a hardship for him.

Then something unbelievable happened. The pro-life prayer warriors that he verbally assaulted decided to start a fund to pay the fine.....and the money flowed in!

I have to admit I felt satisfaction by his arrest but the feeling was short lived as I then felt humbled by this act of forgiveness and generosity. The 40 Days for Life team is made up of people that pray not only for mothers and babies but for all who carry the anger and stain of abortion.

As of this writing, I don't know the final resolution of this situation but I am proud to be aligned with people who care about ALL life...even those who may hate us.






The Lost Ark – October 11
