SAINT AGNES

Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

Lamb of God

What is the purpose of the Lamb of God prayer right before we receive Holy Communion and why do we say it three times?

First of all, it's important to understand what Rite it accompanies. The "fraction Rite" (fractio panis) is the actual focus of what is happening...the breaking of the sacred Host. This action symbolizes Christ's body broken for us, so that when we receive Holy Communion we are one, united with Christ.

"The Priest breaks the Host in half and places a small particle of the Host into the chalice to signify the unity of the Body and Blood of the Lord in the work of salvation, namely of the living and glorious Body of Jesus Christ." (GIRM, 83)

A simple, but important gesture is the conmixtio or commingling...this placing of the particle. Its origins date back to the beginning of Christianity. The Pope celebrated Mass and sent each of the Bishops out to the outskirts of Rome with a small particle (called a fermentum) of the consecrated Host. They would then, introduce the fermentum into the chalice as a sign of Communion with the Pope. Thus the Eucharist is re-enforced as a sign of unity.

Later on, another theological meaning was developed. The union of the two species of the consecrated bread and wine, which were separated, are now combined in the complete person of Jesus Christ. So, when we receive one species, we are in fact, receiving both.

Now...back to the Lamb of God prayer. Pope Sergius (687-701) brought a tradition forward from the Syrian custom...praying the Lamb of God while the Priest is performing this fraction Rite. The intent of this important prayer is to cover the fraction Rite. It is three parts, as we know:

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world...have mercy on us Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world...have mercy on us. Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world...grant us peace.

The number of repetitions is intentional. Note the parallel to the Kyrie ("Lord have mercy.") It must be said at least three times but it can be said as many times as the Priest decides will allow for him to complete the fraction Rite. It must always end with the 'Grant us peace' part.

It can be said or chanted in either English or Latin (Agnus Dei).

The optional "Kiss of peace" precedes this essential prayer and it is important that while offering peace is a great gesture, we don't get carried away with it, while waiting to pray the "Lamb of God."



Then the Priest presents the consecrated Host to the faithful, repeating the words of John the Baptist:

"Behold the Lamb of God, behold Him who takes away the sins of the world...blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb."

We respond with the Centurion's prayer that we are not worthy (which we aren't) to be called to the supper of the Lamb, but ask God to only say the word to heal our souls.

We are reminded of the journey of the risen Lord on the road to Emmaus with some of His disciples. Unaware that they were in the presence of Christ, they only recognized Him in the breaking of the bread.

Today, when we celebrate Mass may we always see the Lamb of God truly present to us in the Eucharist.




