

SAINT AGNES

Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

Happening in this world...

There has a been an extreme persecution happening in Nicaragua. The largest country in Central America, borders Honduras, Costa Rica, the Caribbean Sea, and the Pacific Ocean. Daniel Ortega has been the President of Nicaragua since 2007. A leader of the Sandinistas in the 1980's, he had been the leader of Nicaragua from 1970-1990. His wife is Rosario Murillo who is also Vice-president and considered by some the power behind the presidency. Over the last several months the Ortega dictatorship has taken multiple actions restricting the Catholic Church and charities. I received a call from Unbound (formerly CFCA) informing me that my sponsorship of a young man would be ending as they no longer are permitted to do their mission in Nicaragua. Over 100 non-governmental organizations (NGO's), of the Church and otherwise, like Unbound have been denied the necessary registration to operate. Several Catholic radio stations have been closed and journalists have fled the country. One of the bishops, Bishop Rolando Alvarez was abducted and placed under house arrest, a group of priests, seminarians, and lay man were arrested and placed in prison in Managua named El Chipote that is known for torturing political opponents, and a number of nuns were expelled from the country.

Bold crowds have been protesting in Iran since the death of a 22-year-old woman Mahsa Amini on September 16. Amini died in a hospital in Tehran under suspicious circumstances after being arrested for not wearing the hijab (head covering) according to government regulations. At the police station she had a heart-attack and fell into a coma. Eyewitnesses claim Amini was beaten and therefore died from head injuries caused by police brutality. There have been periodic protests in Iran against the repressive government in 2009, 2017, and 2019. The current protests are larger and more widespread and Iranian security forces have been firing into the groups killing some and beating protesters with batons. Even still the protests persist. While Mahsa was Amini's legal given name (as only Persian names may be registered in Iran), her Kurdish name was Jina (also spelled Zhina), and was the name she was known as to her family.

One of our parishioners was posthumously honored by Bellin Hospital on September 19. A plaque for Mary Jane Bublitz was hung outside of the Intensive Care Unit in gratitude of Mary Jane's longtime volunteer service, more than 10,000 hours. Mary Jane was also a member of Bellin's Concerned Hearts Club for more than 30 years which provides support for those who have had heart surgery and for their families.

"When you are charitable you are sure of never being mistaken. Learn how to understand, to forgive, to be gracious. That's Christianity.
