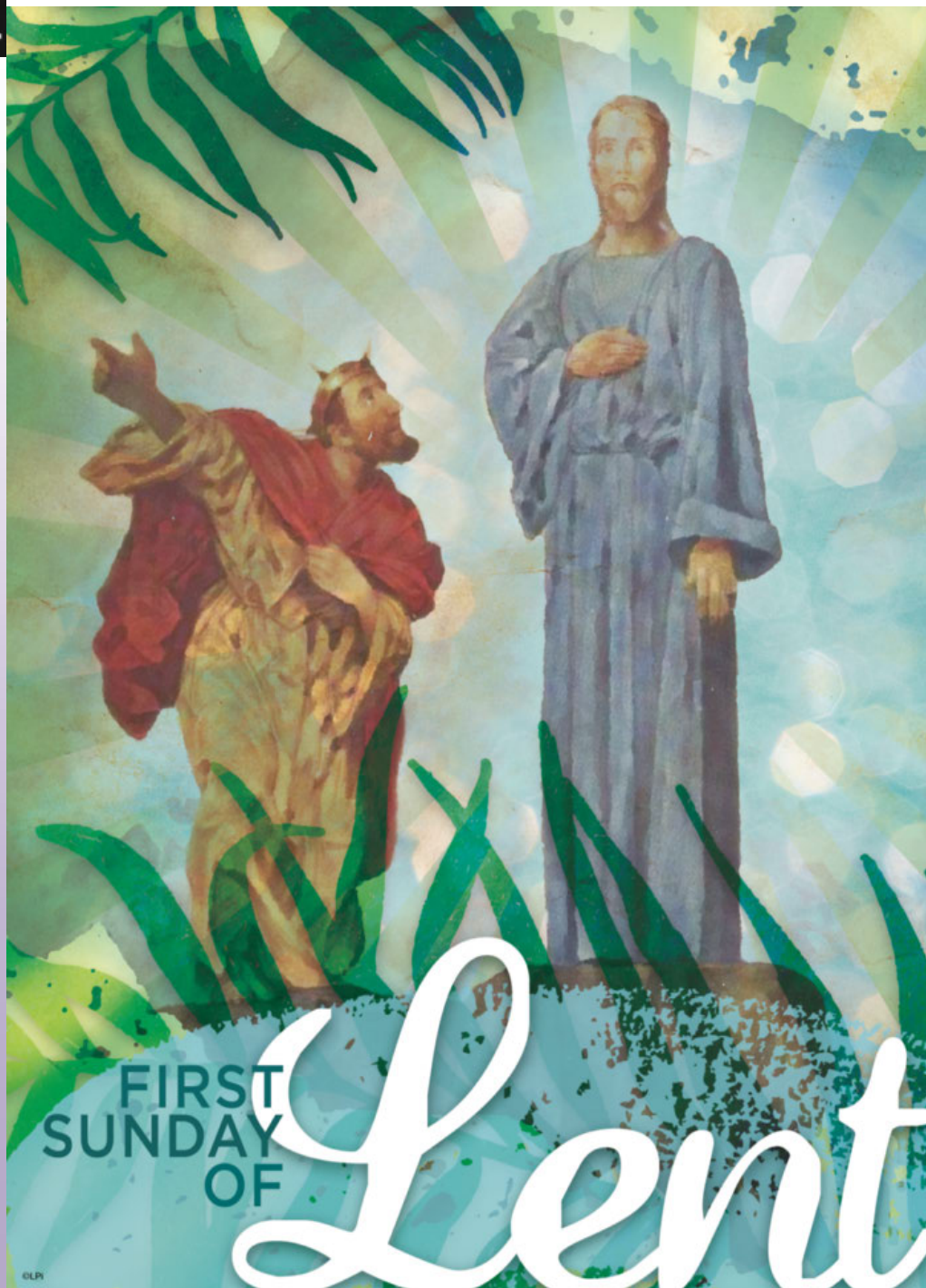

SAINT AGNES

Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

Happening in this World

Peru. There has been societal upheaval in Peru for the last few months that is causing enormous damage to property and the economy. Protests and riots have led to upwards of 2 billion in damage and over 1 million lost jobs. "Peru's crisis underpins the costs of growing political instability in Latin America that is fueled by anger over corruption, weakening economies, and grinding inequality, economists say." (Wall Street Journal, Jan. 31, 2023) I went on a pilgrimage to Peru three years ago so it is very surprising and sad to hear stories of things happening there that are uncommon to Peru and much more typical of other Latin American nations. Peru has been one of the most Latin American countries and with one of the faster growing economies. The cause of the unrest is a conflict between the president and the congress that began December 7th when President Pedro Castillo attempted to close congress. Castillo was quickly impeached and arrested and Vice President Ms. Boluarte took over, becoming the sixth president in five years. Castillo, however, has his supporters who have led the protests, people from the area of the country he is from, an area populated by poorer and indigenous folks. Demonstrations have brought a halt to mining operations and agriculture, leaving fruit rotting and unharvested. Violence spread from rural areas to larger cities including the capital of Lima, causing nearly a hundred road blockages and attempts to take over airports. The problems ripple out from there of course, food and medicine shortages being most serious. Some of the demands of the protesters are for new elections, a new constitution, and increasing the state's role in the free-market economy. Pray for Peru

the gaze that stayed when we denied.

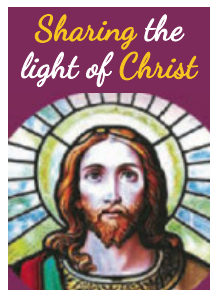
The desert holds your chosen race

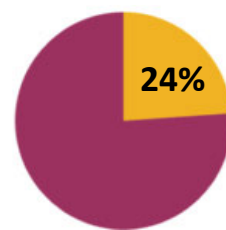

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

The Spirit leads Jesus into the desert to be tempted by the devil, and we hear this: **“He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was hungry.”** Seems like a questionable battle preparation plan. When I fast, I usually feel grouchy at best, and at worst, like I might pass out from longing for a hamburger. Isn't it better to be well-fed and fully hydrated, especially to face spiritual struggles? Why fast?

This might help. The origin of the word “fast” means to “hold firmly.” We still use it that way when we say, “I held *fast* to my original decision.” We human beings are a bundle of desires which vie for our attention: food, drink, comfort, safety, sex, laughter, beauty, and so on. If we can't manage to have firm grip on them, in short order they'll have a firm grip on us. By fasting from our lower desires, we learn to firmly grip on to what is greater. Fasting leads to us to a firmer hold on our body and mind.

Jesus fasts for us. He's showing us that his grace can help us regain this firm hold of our lives, which makes it more difficult for the devil to tempt us. But take it one more step. Fasting also teaches us to finally hold fast to Jesus, the Word of God in flesh. **“Man does not live by bread alone,”** he says, **“But by every word that comes forth from the mouth of God.”** Jesus' fasting reveals his fast hold to the Father in everything. May our fasting help us to grasp ourselves more firmly, and then to hold fast to Jesus alone.

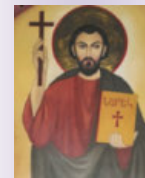
