

SAINT AGNES

Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

Prayers of the Faithful

After the Liturgy of the Word, the Homily and the Profession of Faith, the congregation turns to God in communal prayer. This is also called the Universal prayer.

So what's the purpose and what's happening here?

As the word "universal" implies, we pause to petition God for the universal Church...literally the needs of the worldwide Church are brought forward to God. According to the General Instructions of the Roman Missal (GIRM):

"It is desirable that there be a form of prayer in Masses celebrated with the people so that petitions may be offered for the Holy Church, for those who govern with authority over us, for those weighed down by various needs, for all humanity, and for the salvation of the whole world."

There is a formula to follow and the series of intentions is intended to be (but not limited to):

- 1. for the needs of the Church
- 2. for public authorities and the salvation of the whole world
- 3. for those burdened by any kind of difficulty
- 4. for the local community

It's an ancient tradition that we begin by praying for the Holy Father and the Bishops of the Church as they shepherd us. We pray for our civil leaders, that they lead us in virtue. We pray for the needs of the worldwide church, tragedies that are affecting the human race and end up with the needs of our parish and individuals. We always pray for our beloved dead and the intention of that particular Mass.

As you heard over the past few months, we prayed for the Priests of our Diocese in a particular way, as well as for our seminarians...the future of the Sacraments for us!

You may wonder how these prayers get constructed each week. Carol Kekula begins with some guidance from the USCCB, the Diocese and other sources and then drafts a set of prayers, usually by the middle of the prior week. She gets input from Fr. Patrick and me...incorporating events of the world, the parish, the Liturgical calendar and finalizes the prayers by Saturday. It takes a lot of work and we appreciate Carol's efforts to draw us all together in prayer each week.

We should always bring our own special intentions to mind at this point in the Mass and as Father "ties them all together" in his summary prayer, we hold these private prayers up to God, as well.

It's a great moment in the Mass as we all come together as the people of God, knowing that a very similar version of these prayers are being offered in Catholic parishes from Sydney, Australia to Chilton, Wisconsin. It's the mystical body of Christ at work.






