

#### **SAINT AGNES**

Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

#### **Giving from The Heart**

We all know about the three "pillars" of Lent: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. These pillars are expressions of the fundamental purpose of Lent, which is to turn to God in a conversion of heart.

We have opportunities for all three, all the time, but the one that may have the most complications associated with it, is probably almsgiving.

Take a simple visit to the store. Checking out, we are asked, "Would you like to add a dollar or round up...for such and such a charity? We walk out the door and there are organizations asking for donations for their causes. We walk further to our car and are approached by someone in need asking for a few dollars. We pull up to the first stoplight and there are people holding signs telling us of their life circumstances asking for spare change. All this, before we get home and see our mail with SO many worthy causes asking for money. How are we to sort through all of this and figure out where to give our limited funds?

Asking for the guidance of the Holy Spirit in prayer, needs to be the foundation of our giving efforts.

Of course, as Catholics, we know that one of the precepts of our faith is to "take care of the needs of our church." For me, this is the starting point.

In the Hebrew tradition, charity (Tzedakah) is defined with a hierarchy that dates back to a 12th century Jewish scholar, Maimonides who created the "eight rungs of giving." Each rung represents a higher degree of virtue.

On an ascending level, they are:

- 8. The lowest...giving grudgingly and making the recipient feel disgraced or embarrassed.
- 7. Giving cheerfully, but giving too little.
- 6. Giving cheerfully and adequately but only after being asked.
- 5. Giving before being asked.
- 4. Giving when you do not know who the individual is that is benefiting, but the recipient knows your identity.
- 3. Giving when you know the individual benefiting but the recipient doesn't know your identity.
- 2. Giving when neither the donor nor the recipient knows the other's identity.
- 1. The highest...Giving in a dignified fashion such that the recipient benefits in a way so as to become self-reliant.

In a recent Gospel account from Mark we heard of Jesus healing the leper and telling the man to "tell no one but go show yourself to the priests." This was necessary for the priests to authenticate the healing. It was important for the man to be given the important label, "clean" so he could become self reliant and begin a new life of independence.



Jesus does this elsewhere in Scripture as well. On Ash Wednesday we heard Matthew's account where Jesus teaches His listeners to pray, fast and give alms "in secret" where only your heavenly Father sees it. Jesus says, "... and your Father who sees in secret will repay you."

Credit for good works was never a priority for Jesus and this points clearly toward the highest level of giving, from the hierarchy above. The new Testament again pointing to the old.

As Lent unfolds before us, let's pray to the Holy Spirit for guidance in our almsgiving. May we always give from the heart without any expectation of credit. God will know our heart and that's the only "tax receipt" we will ever need.




