Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

#### Shrewd and Simple

"Behold, I am sending you out like sheep in the midst of wolves; so be as shrewd as serpents and simple as doves." –Matthew 10:16

In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus is sending the twelve out all over Israel to announce that the kingdom of God is at hand. He gives them some very unusual instructions as He does so.

What does it mean to be shrewd and simple, at the same time?

These are virtues that underpin our lives as Christians. Shrewdness or prudence and simplicity or singleness of purpose must work in tandem. They strengthen and complement each other. The Apostles and we, need to be smart so we don't miss even a single opportunity to proclaim the Gospel while at the same time, live a simple focused life.

To be simple in a spiritual sense means to live an intentional life. Behaving with firmness and consistency with our eyes geared toward the things of Heaven. Prudence always points out the most appropriate way of achieving our goal. Prudence without simplicity can easily become cunning or manipulative.

In other words, demonstrate prudence in the ways of God, not the world. The prudent person is not, as is often believed, the person who knows how to make their way in the world in order to get the most for themselves. They are, rather, the person who constructs their life with sound morals and a well-developed conscience.

The Catholic Catechism teaches us that "prudence is the guiding of our conscience helping us to overcome doubts about the good to achieve and the evil to avoid." St. Augustine calls it..."what helps us go toward God vs what hinders us."

Jesus has laid out the path for us. He makes His grace available to us because He knows that the world is harsh, and we would need this prudence/simplicity skill combination. Let us pray that we always put these virtues to work in our walk toward holiness.


# St. Agnes Community of Christian Women

#### World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

In 2021, Pope Francis established the celebration of the World Day for Grandparents and Elderly on the fourth Sunday of July, near the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus, to emphasize the pastoral care of the elderly as a priority. Not only are grandchildren and young people called upon to be present in the lives of older people, but older people and grandparents also have a mission of evangelization, proclamation and prayer, and of encouraging young people in their faith.

Pope Francis has chosen a line from Psalm 71 ~ "Do not cast me off in my old age." ~ as the theme for 2024.


