SAINT AGNES

Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

Gathering Together in a Common Purpose

Our readings this weekend remind us that long before contemporary politicians used the concept of change as a campaign mantra, the command to change one's lifestyle and priorities has been central to our Christian experience. The first reading recounts how the Israelite community grumbled and even wished they had stayed in Egypt, to which the Lord responded with a new form of bread for them to eat – manna. Next, St. Paul advises the Ephesians to "put on a new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth." In the Gospel reading, Jesus tells the crowd, "Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life...."

All this talk of change can be intimidating because it demands that we give up something in order to make room for something new in our lives. It calls us out of our comfort zones and into the real world with real people. Recently our parish hosted a service mission camp called F.I.A.T., which stands for "Faith in Action Today." We were blessed to have 18 middle and high school students join us for four days of serious weeding and yard work for some of our parishioners. And, unlike the Israelites in the desert, not one grumble was heard from the group, even in hot temperatures.

Along with work we made time for Mass, Adoration, Confession, and the Rosary. Guest speakers also gave them ideas to think about, like how we can recognize the Holy Spirit in our lives and why beautiful art draws us to a closer relationship with God. Lisa Urick, our Youth Minister, has been leading F.I.A.T. for four years now and does a great job at directing students to look for meaning in their service to others. As adults we realize it can be challenging for youth to give up their free summer days for unpaid work in the hot sun at strangers' houses. Hopefully these four days of service have strengthened their commitment to their Catholic faith. In a world that treats our faith with indifference and sometimes disdain, gathering together in a common purpose helps us carry on and trade in our worries for hopeful smiles.






Did you know that two saints with August feast days died in World War II at Auschwitz?
