

Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

Praise the Lord! Next weekend, the 24th SUN of ORD Time will be our first weekend with our merged Mass schedule. As a reminder, our Saturday Mass of 4:15 remains the same. Our three Masses will have moved to two Masses. The first Mass being at 8:15am and our second Mass time being at **10:00am**. Thank you for your understanding and participation in helping to make this a smooth transition. Perhaps something to consider is to enter the Church through our new carport area. As you know the doors facing the parking lot bring a lot of people to the near-side section of the church. The far-side of the church (by 9th St.) will most certainly have more places to sit. Unless everyone reads this and then everyone moves to that side! Speaking of the carport, we will be blessing the new addition to our church next weekend as well after the 10am Mass. Lastly, a reminder to those who have had their intentions at the 11am Mass, our office will be in touch with you to move that intention to another time. Thank you for adapting to this request. We take seriously our obligation and duty to pray for those we love both living and deceased.

Two weeks ago, I spoke about "Pro Populo" that is "For the People". Pro Populo is simply the Latin phrase and reminds us of the Church's seriousness about praying for our parish community once a week. I also shared with you the Roman Missal's Eucharistic Prayer I. One of four different options, I generally gravitate to praying this particular prayer because it is the most ancient of our Eucharistic prayers and has an emphasis on the sacrificial dimension of the Mass. Finally, I spoke about our move from a commentator/reader ministry to that of a strictly reader ministry. The practical change you notice is the reader focuses solely on the scriptural readings. In respecting the pride of place of sacred silence in the Liturgy, we honor parishioners' desire to pray in the sacred silence both before the Mass and during the sacred intervals of silence during Mass. Since we will not have the hymns announced, please place your attention to the music song boards. If you have trouble seeing them, we are looking into larger print numbers. In the meantime, a suggestion would be to sit closer to the boards themselves. As Cardinal Sarah states, "Catholic liturgy is something sacred, something which is holy by its very nature. Catholic liturgy is no ordinary human gathering." Moving to a liturgy with an emphasis on a deeper contemplative component of the mysteries of Christ is our aim. To that end, in conjunction with our moving to simply the reader, we will be implementing antiphons during the Mass. What is an antiphon? It is a refrain with verses that match the particular liturgical celebration. Think of them as benchmarks to prepare our hearts for the themes of both the readings and Roman Missal Prayers. An antiphon is a short chant in Christian ritual, sung as a refrain. The texts of antiphons are usually taken from the Psalms or Scripture. Their form was favored by St. Ambrose and they feature prominently in Ambrosian chant, but they are used widely in Gregorian chant as well. They may be used during Mass, for the Introit, the Offertory or the Communion.

They may also be used in the Liturgy of the Hours, typically for Lauds or Vespers. The biggest difference you will see is that the antiphon refrain will be sung by our cantors before moving into the opening hymn. In time, as we get used to the antiphon we will incorporate verses. Prayer is a call and response between God and man. The antiphon emulates this dynamic of prayer communally for the faithful. An antiphon will be used after the priest consumes the Eucharist after consecration as well. On the weekend of September 28th and 29th, we will begin the use of antiphons at the beginning of Mass and during the time of Communion. This is a brief catechesis on antiphons but in the coming weeks, I hope to address it more in depth during the homily time. Now & Forever!

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture Mk 7:31-37

One of the most touching YouTube videos I've ever seen is one in which a deaf woman receives new technology to heal her hearing. She hears her husband's voice for the first time — and her own, too — and bursts into tears of overwhelming joy. It must have been like an immovable wall between her and her loved ones came tumbling down.

We are all like this woman, to some degree. We believe in the presence of God's love, but we can't hear Him. We can't speak well about Him. The deaf man who can't speak properly in the Gospel today is an image of what God wants us to experience again and again. Jesus takes the man aside to a private place away from the crowd, touches his ears and tongue, and says, "**Ephphatha**!" The man's ears are opened, and he speaks clearly. Contact with Christ has this effect on us.

This experience happens to us in our baptism, almost exactly. It happens to us in the liturgy. It happens in our private prayer. It happens when we hear the voice of God in our conscience. The more we engage these privileged channels of Jesus' healing, the more we are empowered to hear and speak of the presence of God's perfect love.


