Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

Keep Holy the Sabbath 2.0

A few years ago I wrote an article regarding the need and obligation to God, for us to keep the Sabbath holy by attending Mass faithfully on Sundays and Holy days of obligation. This is a follow up regarding our proper behavior and disposition in praying the Mass.

Here are ten simple rules for each of us to follow:

1. Prepare for Mass. Read the readings before Mass. There are numerous resources available to find the weekly readings, in addition to several phone apps. Here are two:

Magnificat.... www.us.magnificat.net. Less than \$1 per week.

Laudate.... free app.

Both sources have daily readings and much more.

- 2. Be on time. We should be seated and ready for Mass to begin and use the quiet to be ready to meet our Lord. Prepare yourself silently in prayer. This is respectful to God and to fellow parishioners.
- 3. Dress appropriately. We should dress for Mass as if a King has invited us to a feast...because He has. Genuflect toward the tabernacle upon entering Church, understanding that God, Himself is present there.
- 4. Leave all distractions behind. Turn off or leave cell phones in the car. God gives us 168 hours each week. Can we not return ONE hour per week with our full attention?
- 5. Keep loud talk out of the main church. The greeting area was built for that purpose. Always remember that Jesus is present in the Tabernacle and people are praying.
- 6. Participate. PRAY the Mass. The Mass is a Holy and sacred act. The prayers we offer are all lifted up to God, in community. The prayers you offer after receiving Holy Communion are particularly powerful.
- 7. Be properly disposed to receive Holy Communion. As Catholics we know that the Eucharist is really and truly the body, blood, soul and divinity of Our Lord Jesus Christ. This means we fast for an hour before reception and we approach in reverence and respect...not in a state of grave sin. Confession is available frequently to "begin again". If you are not a Catholic, please come forward for a blessing. Simply fold your arms over your chest.
- 8. Don't worry about your children making noise. Really...don't worry. This is the "music of the Church." Believe me, I've been there as a parent worrying about this. If a child gets extra loud...take a short break, but by all means don't stress over this. Jesus said "Bring the children to me...." He meant it!

9. This is important.

Don't rush out. Stay until the end of Mass. Mass ends when Father gives the final blessing and we say "Thanks be to God".

The back row of chairs are only for those unable to come forward for Communion. Everyone one else should receive at the altar which is reinforcement of a communal rite.

It shouldn't look like a NASCAR event after Communion with people rushing out. If you're worried about the parking lot, consider staying an extra 5-10 minutes to pray! We have so much to be thankful for.

10. Consider/pray over all the opportunities that are mentioned frequently...ushers, greeters, taking Communion to the home bound, etc. Share your time, treasure and talent with YOUR parish.

Lastly, please pray for our Priests (and Deacons) and for more vocations from our families.



Catechetical Sunday September 15, 2024

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Take Up Your Cross

When I'm interviewing people for my job as a staff writer at an archdiocesan newspaper, I like to ask them this question: At the end of your life, when you meet God, what do you want to hear Him say?

I've gotten a lot of interesting answers.

"I called and you listened."

"What tee time would you like tomorrow?"

"What were you thinking?"

"Your service made things better."

It's a question I've thought a lot about, personally. What I want to hear God say when I finally see His face is this: "You can put it down now."

When Jesus asks his disciples "Who do you say that I am?" he is not just asking them to verbalize an answer. He is asking them to do something: pick up the cross. Find the problems in this world, in this life, and throw your arms around them. Drag them to God, even if it kills you. It's not enough to stand by the sidelines, watching Christ ascend to Calvary, nodding your head in approval. Yes, I agree. Yes, I believe. Yes, Jesus, good job! You have to follow in every bloody footprint he leaves in the dust. Set your face like flint. And when you meet him at the top, you better not be empty-handed. He has a cross, he will expect you to have one, too.

I hope that I can do it. I hope that I am strong enough. I am not one of those great, hardy souls. I stumble terribly under the weight of my very small cross. I grumble as I shift it from shoulder to shoulder. But every time I have been almost at the point of giving up, almost ready to lay it down, there is something — Someone — who supports my drooping arm. The Lord God is my help.

If, at the end of everything, I hear the words, "You can put it down now," then I will know I have made it. I will know I have not failed: I took up the cross.

"Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." Matthew 16:24


