

SAINT AGNES

Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

A Conversation About the Commandments

In today's Gospel, we witness an encounter between Jesus and one of the scribes. Jesus is asked which commandment comes first. His response is well known to us: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength..." This expression of entirety has great significance as it allows no reserve of loyalty for anyone other than God. It reminds me of the greeting that Mary received from the Angel Gabriel, "Hail Mary, full of grace." As we are reminded on First Saturdays when we pray the Rosary prior to morning Mass, if Mary was full of grace then there could be no room in her for sin. Our love for God must involve our whole being; it's all or nothing as we strive for continuous perfection in virtue out of love for Him.

The second commandment in terms of importance is to love our neighbor as ourselves. Here again there are no conditions or levels of sincerity mentioned. It's a clear and simple commandment, and the fact that Jesus lists it immediately after his first answer makes us believe that the two commandments are inseparable. We are to be concerned with the salvation of souls in addition to their wellbeing and temporal needs. One way of expressing love for neighbors is to provide for these needs while expecting nothing in return. Our religious education students will get a chance to do just this as they rake leaves for nearby parishioners this November. (We're taking the commandment quite literally here.) Please contact our office if you or someone you know could use help with cleaning up a yard.

The month of October was dedicated to the Holy Rosary, and we took the opportunity recently to teach our younger students how to pray this wonderful prayer. Those of us who have been praying the Rosary for years shared our zeal for it with the students and we did our best to guide them through the prayers of the first Glorious Mystery. It takes practice and reflection to grow in appreciation for prayer like this. I hope that our efforts take root in the hearts of our students, leading to genuine faith in their one Lord, whom they should love with all their heart, all their soul, all their mind, and all their strength. Please keep us all in your prayers.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Mark 12:28b-34

Americans have long been fascinated with public debates. Farmers stood in muddy fields for hours to hear Lincoln and Douglas dispute each other in the 1860 presidential run-up. The televised debate between Kennedy and Nixon in 1960 fascinated the nation. These days, cable news outlets and social media parse every word spoken by candidates. We still love seeing public, rational disputes in the service of our nation.

In his day, Jesus also captured attention as a public debater. Mark tells us, **“And one of the scribes came up and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, asked him, ‘Which commandment is the first of all?’”** Jesus’ brief but all-encompassing response is the double command to love God and neighbor. Notice that he includes the importance of loving God with **“all your mind.”** Loving God is not simply a question of affection, loyalty, good deeds, and religious dedication. It demands honest and intense intellectual engagement — just like an accomplished debater.

How do we do this practically? One simple way is by embracing ourselves as life-long learners. Setting aside time for reading, book studies, online classes, and, perhaps most difficult, engaging in open, honest, and curious conversation with those who think differently from us. These are all great ways to love God with our minds. Our country and our Church depend greatly on souls who love God in this way with their minds. Let’s commit to loving God with all our minds in tireless pursuit of truth.
