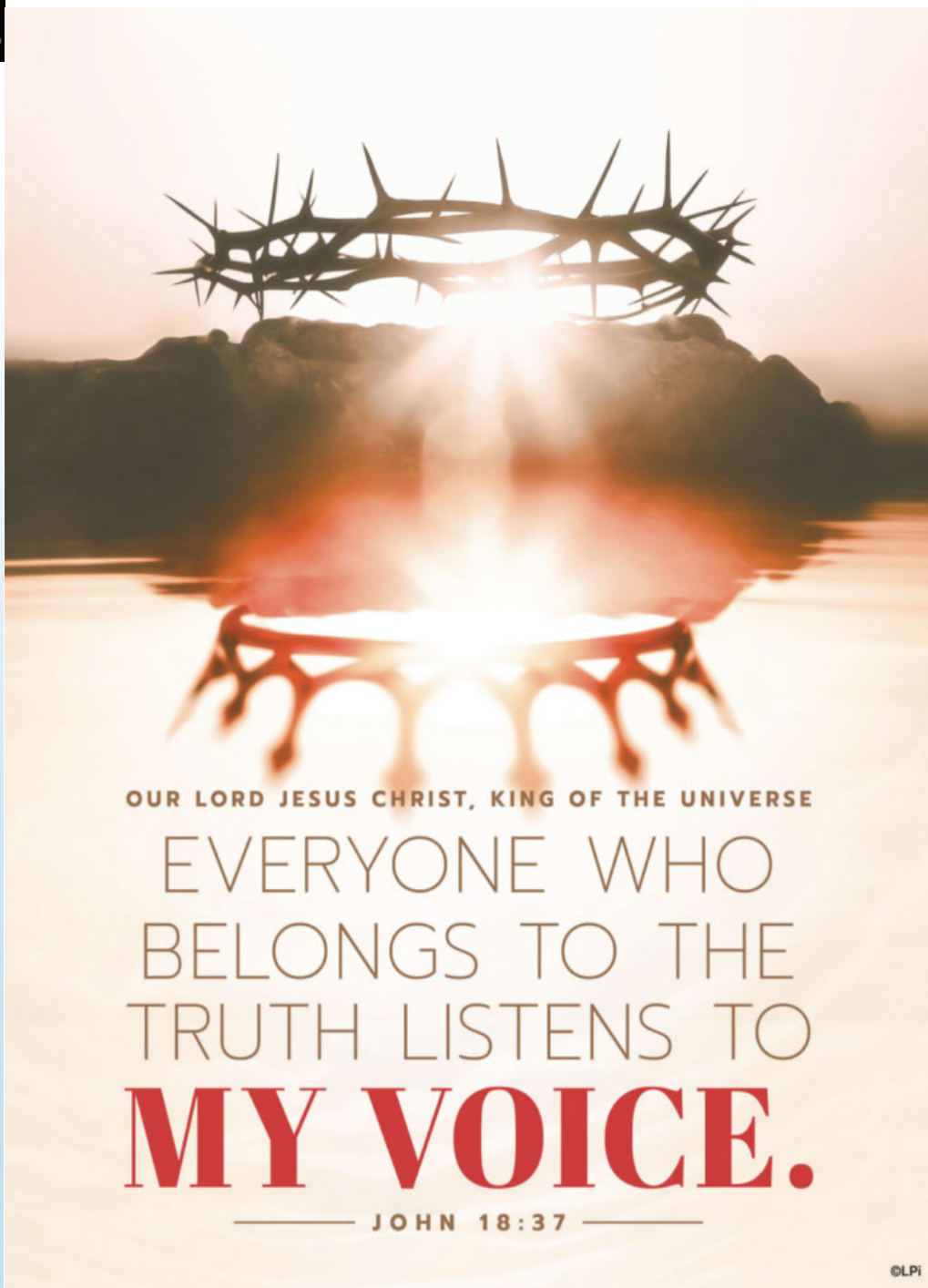

Praise the Lord! Christ is King! It is such a weird statement if you think of it. We don't really have kings anymore. We speak a lot about representative republics and democracies, but when it comes to kings, we don't see many of them around anymore. We see Burger King. Or we play king of the hill. We may even say that dad's lazy boy is his throne. There are references to kings but for all practical purposes we really don't know what it would be like to be a king or to have a king govern us. In political science we call a kingship a monarchy. There is something actually quite fascinating about a monarchy. If you've seen *The Crown*, a rather recent and famous mini-series, the chronicled life of Queen Elizabeth through the decades is fascinating. We would be very amused at the fact that kings and queens were quite human with all their foibles out there for everyone to see and hear about. Kings sometimes have to wait in hiding and then come to the throne after years of waiting. In the case of Charles, he had to wait a considerable amount of time before he was king. Monarchy by its very nature has similar attributes to Catholicism. The popes old miter used to be a crown. It represented the kingship of Christ on earth, both his temporal rule and his eternal rule. This, however, changed most recently under Benedict XVI where the miter itself no longer had the crown aspect, but more of the pastoral approach of the shepherd as the main focus. In times of tyranny, Christians yell at the tyrants, "CHRIST IS KING." We've seen this recently where globalist expansionists try to usurp the rule of the proletariat. Sometimes we have to wait for Christ to become enthroned in our hearts. We follow other kings like pleasure, prestige, power and the like. When Christ does become KING of our hearts, we can cry out all the more and say, "Christ is king!" To make the declaration then on this the Feast of Christ, King of the Universe, we are saying that He is the crown of our heart, He is the ruler of my life. He governs me and is a monopolist's monarchy of sorts because there isn't any part of my life that He does not rule. Perhaps it would do us good, however, to see this ruling of Christ as benevolent. There are good kings and bad kings. Many movies are about kings who were bad, but in rare cases when a king is benevolent, the nation becomes a blessing to its citizens and its neighbors. Jesus Christ's rule of our hearts is filled with love, it is filled with compassion, mercy and forgiveness. Maybe Christ the King as a statement of fact is not so weird after all. Maybe Christ the King makes more sense than anything else at all.

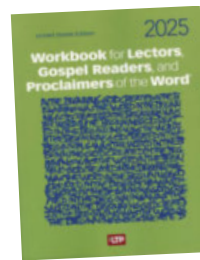

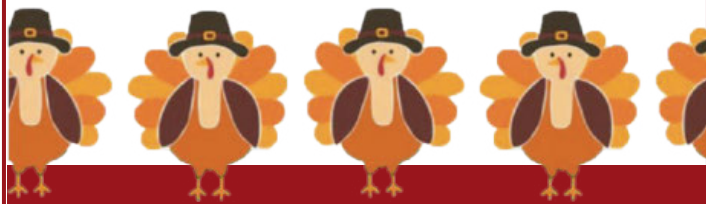
