Praise the Lord! Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. The Feast itself is a relatively new one in the life of the Church. Often when we think of feast days, we think they have been around for centuries. Not so with the Feast of the Holy Family. Pope Leo XIII promoted it in the 17th century. Pope Benedict XV added it officially to the liturgical calendar in 1921. It was originally celebrated the Sunday after the epiphany but was moved to the Sunday after Christmas in 1969. Perhaps because so many other things were in flux at that time, they thought why not move it closer to the Nativity. In one way it made sense because of the Nativity celebrating the Incarnation with Jesus Christ, the Blessed Virgin Mary and Saint Joseph being the model of the family. That seemed to make more sense than in the wake of three kings journeying from afar. It reminds me of our early trips down to Chicago to see my grandparents when I was a kid. The whole family would pile into the Ford LTD. When I mean pile, I mean pile because I was either on the armrest between dad and mom with the ash tray between my knees, the back floorboard laying down taking a nap, or I was stuffed on the back ledge of the rear window. Being the youngest and the littlest had its pros and cons. Depending on where I was placed would be considered either good or bad. I had it placed in sequential order. Each of our families come with their own distinct blessings and curses. We are positioned uniquely in our families for a particular plan and purpose. For some of us, our placement is not much of a positive, but for others, it is a real blessing. No matter what our position in the family, the part we have to play is to help serve the other. I heard a great acronym for FAMILY. Forget About Me, I Love You. In essence that is the part that makes a family holy. We begin to forget ourselves and begin to love the other. Jesus' place in the Holy Family was to point to the will of the Father. Hence, the appropriateness of being in the Temple close to God. His other position was to be obedient to Mary and Joseph. He drew everyone around Him to the Father through His obedience to the Will of God. These are two ways this Christmas Octave we can position ourselves within our own families. We can be close to God--going to Mass regularly and worshiping God, learning about His ways. Secondly, we can go about the business of doing the Father's will. These two places will do us good when it comes to evangelizing our own families. Now & Forever!




