

Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

Praise the Lord! We are concluding the Christmas season proper this weekend and what better way to celebrate than to experience the Baptism of our Lord Jesus Christ. Funny to think that Jesus was baptized, isn't it? For what purpose? The notion of the sinless Son of the Father to receive the sacrament of Baptism is strange indeed. Judaism had the rite of baptism, and it was the purification Tvilah. However, in Jesus' case it wasn't so much that He was being purified but that He was purifying the world by being baptized into the world. In effect, the world became baptized through Him. The remarkable part of all of this is that Jesus' mission is to sanctify the world, to make it a re-generative spring of water. In this day and age, when darkness gets the better of us at times, it is important to realize that Jesus has made clean the waters of baptism for us. He has transformed the world and made it new through His coming into existence and His immersion into the world of sin. It's almost as if the waters of the Jordan are purified and break open before us. Like the Red Sea that becomes the channel by which the Israelites are saved so too does the water of the Jordan become the manifestation of Jesus' relationship with the Father. The Father says to Jesus, "You are my son in whom I am well pleased." Jesus shares with us through our own baptism the ability to share with Him everything that He has in communion with the Father. This is the final manifestation of the identity of Jesus. The first manifestation was Jesus as the son of Mary. Born of the Virgin, Jesus brings His humanity and Divinity into the world through the fiat or YES of Mary. The Nativity becomes the illumination of Jesus as the One to come into the world. Secondly, Jesus is manifested through the celebration of Mary in the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. In this manifestation, Jesus' divine reality is expressed in a deeper and more profound way. By declaring Mary, Mother of God, the Church in effect is highlighting the divine nature of Jesus. Third, the Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus' glory and grandeur. The Epiphany is showing to us that Jesus is the glory of the Father as the Three Wise Men come from afar to bring Him gifts. That brings us to today's celebration, of course, the Baptism of our Lord. This completes the manifestation of who Jesus is. It then goes even deeper by giving us the chance to participate in His divine life. Baptism then becomes for us a way to manifest Jesus to the world through our very being in conformity with Him. Amen, alleluia! Now & Forever!

JUBILEE YEAR 2025 PILGRIMS OF HOPE

From Bishop Ricken's Decree concerning the Jubilee Year 2025

This Jubilee officially opens within the Diocese of Green Bay on January 6, 2025 at St. Francis Xavier Cathedral in Green Bay, Wisconsin.

The Jubilee Year will formally conclude on the Solemnity of Epiphany of the Lord, on January 6, 2026.

With the guidance of the letter from his Holiness Pope Francis of May 13, 2024, according to which an indulgence is granted to the faithful on the occasion of this Jubilee Year of Hope, I designate the following as sacred places of pilgrimage in the Diocese of Green Bay:

St. Francis Xavier Cathedral - Green Bay, Wisconsin The Shrine of Our Lady of Champion -Champion, Wisconsin

St. Pius X Parish - Appleton, Wisconsin

Thus, a plenary indulgence might be obtained by devoutly visiting any of the Jubilee pilgrimage sites listed in this Decree.



The "Jubilee Year of Hope" logo depicts four stylized figures representing humanity from all corners of the earth, embracing each other to signify unity and brotherhood, with the leading figure prominently holding onto a

cross that transforms into an anchor at the bottom, symbolizing hope amidst life's challenges, particularly during turbulent times, as the cross-anchor is lowered into wavy lines representing the journey of life; essentially conveying the message that even in difficult situations, hope remains a strong anchor to hold onto.


The Baptism of the Lord Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

In my second year of theology studies, I went to confession to a priest visiting the seminary for a three-day retreat. My heart wasn't in it. I was going through the motions. I confessed my sins and waited for his response. The priest said, "For your penance, I'd like you to go into the chapel and repeat the words 'You are my beloved Son, with you I am well pleased' (Luke 3:22) until they mean something to you." Easy penance, I thought.

But to my surprise, I struggled to say those words. I sensed a strong interior resistance blocking them. How could God be well-pleased with me? He couldn't be, I thought. A battle within me ensued. Two hours later, the resistance vanished, and I found myself able to speak, and claim as my own, those marvelous words. I emerged from the chapel with a new, deep, peaceful conviction that I was indeed God's beloved son.

Those words are a precious gift from heaven to all of us. Jesus' baptism, which we celebrate this week, offers them to us. Are we willing to receive these words anew? Many things can block this deepening of our baptismal identity: failings, sins, disappointments, traumas, problems, and so on. Yet God's love is always greater. This week I challenge you to prayerfully repeat these words over yourself — or perhaps over someone you're struggling to love — until those words find a home in your heart.


