

SAINT AGNES

Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

Lectio Divina and the Very Impatient Reader

Our Gospel reading today tells the story of a new family with an enormous responsibility ahead of them. Mary and Joseph presented baby Jesus at the temple in Jerusalem, following the law of the Lord. They were confronted by Simeon, the old man waiting to see the Christ child. How strange his message must have seemed to the couple, especially the words, "and you yourself a sword will pierce." Chilling thought for any mother.

I'm intrigued by the part about Mary and Joseph "fulfilling all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord" before they returned home. With all that comes with being new parents, and in this case new parents of the Son of God, one might understand their haste to get on with setting up their home and other details. But they followed the law to the letter and gave the Lord his due. Mary and Joseph exhibited patience here, showing attention to the meaningful ritual and allowing the community of believers to witness this blessed occasion.

Patience is in short supply in our world today. I even find that my manner of reading tends to be brisk, as if there's a blue ribbon waiting for me at the end of a passage. Read too fast and one can miss out on the nuances in literature, the meaning of a well-crafted sentence. The same goes for scripture reading. Last year in our staff meetings at St. Agnes, we began reading the coming Sunday's Gospel with the Lectio Divina approach. Read, read again, then reflect, pray, and share insights. It forced me to slow down and carefully consider the Gospel, searching for my own discoveries of meaning and beauty in the passages. Listening to another person's take on the reading was helpful, too.

Lectio Divina is not a new practice. True to form, I used to find it repetitive and cumbersome. I think it will always be a challenge for me to slow down and reflect on the words I'm reading, but our weekly Lectio Divina is helping. As mere humans, attempting to understand all that we find in the Bible is daunting. But the more we try, the closer we grow to God. And becoming familiar with the Gospel reading prior to Mass on Sunday is an excellent habit. It's a conditioning of the mind that helps us focus on what is important, what our Lord wants us to understand.




