

In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

Praise the Lord! It would be easy for us to focus on the pure impossibility of this weekend's Gospel. Jesus has some rather difficult sayings for us to follow. Indeed, not only difficult and impossible but after reading them, one cannot but have the feeling of incredulousness. To assuage your thoughts, this is guite alright! In fact, it is very normal to read Luke 6:27-28 and feel rather perturbed and unsettled. We may think, "How in the world am I to possibly live these teachings out in my life?" The key perhaps is something much later in the Gospel passage. In a sense, it is the key to understanding the supernatural and mysteriousness of Jesus' message. He says, "...a good measure, packed together, shaken down, and overflowing, will be poured into your lap." What in the world is He speaking of with this "good measure?" In a word it is GRACE. What can we think of as grace? It seems like such a lofty and unrealistic word. I think of it as this. When I was young, barreling through an obstacle in life seemed like the best solution. A dogged determination to plow through pains and difficulties. As I get older, perhaps a bit of wisdom begins to set in--I no longer have to plow or barrel through. Rather, as one gets older, the patient resolve to move through suffering, pain and difficulty becomes a much more participatory journey. Grandparents and great-grandparents have this in spades. In short, they have grace. Grace to see the impossibility of a given situation and an abandonment to God's ways as being better than my ways. Grace is the good measure. Grace is packed together. Grace is shaken down. Grace is overflowing. Grace is poured into your lap. This grace that Jesus speaks of is the hidden wisdom of the aged. It is the storied lives of those who have gone through it all. Each and every one of Jesus' teachings today are impossible to be sure. However, the focus is not on what is impossible but what becomes possible through the accumulative grace received through our lives. Now & Forever!


