SAINT AGNES

Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

Bulletin Deadline Monday noon Today's readings show us the importance of truthfulness. The reading from the book of Sirach shows us that we need to take care in how we speak. "Praise no one before he speaks, for it is then that people are tested." Our speech tends to trip us up spiritually faster than almost anything else. Whether it's sharing uncharitable comments about others or using the Lord's name in a way that is less-than-reverent, our words reflect our level of care.

As leaders in the Religious Education program here at St. Agnes, we're on the watch for those habits in children which need correction. The month of January was dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus. This was an opportunity for us to make students aware of how they might misuse the Lord's name in everyday speech. Our American culture may not find it objectionable at all to say, "Oh my God!" casually and without thought for the name we hold sacred, but as Catholics we must correct this flawed habit. Ultimately, it comes down to self-control and fear of the Lord, our "fear" being that sense of dread at the thought of offending our Lord.

Luke's Gospel explores the idea of truthfulness even further with Jesus' parable about hypocrisy. The antidote to hypocrisy is knowing ourselves well and then acting accordingly. We are not being self-absorbed by spending time reflecting on our lives so we may know when we have said "yes" to God and when we have fallen short. The season of Lent offers a chance to practice reflection as a way of knowing ourselves better, which leads to truthfulness in our interaction with others. Jesus is calling us to remove the plank from our own eye before looking for faults in others. Let us use this Lent to carry out our self-examination every day, building a habit that will bring us closer to God.

Our Religious Education program continues its Seroogy's Candy Bar Sale this weekend. Coming up on March 15 and 16 we will have our annual Kringle Coupon Sale. Look for free samples of Kringle from Uncle Mike's after all three Masses. Then, on April 2, we will host the Hydrant Pizza Truck outside Door 6 at Holy Family School from 6:30 pm – 8:30 pm. Pre-sale order forms are coming soon.

Lastly, our parish Lenten Almsgiving Tree will return to the narthex in church in March. Please help our parish collect items for local charities supporting young mothers and children. We like to involve our students in the sorting process, reminding them how important it is to be charitable to those who may be struggling to raise their children.

Lent 2025 at St. Agnes

Lenten Disciplines of Fasting & Abstinence

Each Catholic is asked to preserve the penitential purpose and character of Lent. Therefore:

- Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to <u>abstain from meat</u> on Ash Wednesday and each Friday of Lent.
- Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, in addition to abstaining from meat, should <u>fast</u>, that is
 eat only one full meal on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Smaller quantities of food may be taken at
 two other meals, but no food should be consumed at other times during those two days. The obligation
 of fasting ceases with the celebration of one's 59th birthday.

These practices are designed for spiritual growth. Catholics are not to excuse themselves lightly from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.


