

Saint Agnes was born in 291 into a Roman family of nobility and raised in a Christian family. She suffered martyrdom for her faith and commitment to her virginity as a young teen on January 21, 304. In art she is often portrayed holding a lamb, a symbol of innocence. Saint Agnes is the patron saint of young girls.

Give thanks to the Lord! Today marks the first Sunday of Lent. It should come to no surprise that the month of March often gives way to the beginning of this new liturgical season. However, there are other things happening in March that may be more commonly celebrated in our culture. For instance, we have the day before Lent, Mardi Gras. Originally its intention was to have one last celebration before entering into prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Or we may be familiar with Saint Patrick's Day as celebrated on March 17th commemorating the evangelization of Ireland by Saint Patrick. Last but not least, there is March Madness. This college basketball tournament captivates a vast audience of sports enthusiasts every year. With either sports or the secularization of a saint, we often think of luck as a large component of the festivities. A team may need luck to win the tournament coupled with skill and hard work. 


