

Give thanks to the Lord for He is good! Live and let live. Forgive and forget. These are sayings we often hear, but did you know they have a significant meaning when it comes to this weekend's Gospel? The story of the Prodigal Son is just as much a story as it is about a faithful Father. The Father states toward the end of the reading,"...your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found." Letting someone go, to "live and let live" so to say is not for the faint of heart. Imagine if you will, the terrible pain and anguish the father must have felt for the waywardness of His son. For many, the imagining part is not necessary because so many mothers and fathers have seen their sons and daughters walk away from the Catholic faith entirely. Perhaps there isn't a drastic dissipation of their lives such as the prodigal son, but their faith has dissipated before the distractions of modern secular life. The truth is that God has allowed us the opportunity and has let us live. The Father gives us room to make mistakes. This Triduum's Exsultet prayer states, "O happy fault, O necessary sin of Adam." God has given us the freedom to make mistakes. He does not belabor us to believe we are less than the sum of who we are--for we are His. This is what matters! Secondly, and at the heart of the Prodigal Son and the Faithful Father is the forgiveness immediately given to the Son. The father runs out to Him. He offers a meal and celebration for him. Forgetfulness is actually freedom to forgiveness. Maybe we can call it spiritual amnesia. It is a grace to forget transgressions in the moment and to extend one's love to the other. It is an instantaneous outpouring of compassion. The most difficult part of forgiveness it seems is seeing our own inability to forget. However, when unconditional love has been lavished upon us, we can't help but share that with others. This Lent when we live and let live and when we forgive and forget we are characters of this parable in a sense. We are fathers and mothers and sons and daughters whose lives hinge on God's forgiveness for our very selves. His mercy endures forever!

There are prerequisites for Holy Communion.

The Bread and Wine for celebrating the Eucharist.

- The bread (hosts) must be made only from wheat and water, and according to the ancient tradition of the Latin Church, must be unleavened.
- The Celebrant Host is of a size that allows the priest to break it into parts to share with the faithful while also maintaining proper dignity and respect for the Blessed Sacrament.
- The wine must be natural, from the fruit of the grape, pure and incorrupt, not mixed with other substances, and approved for sacramental use. During the Eucharistic Sacrifice, a small quantity of water is mixed with the wine.
- Parishes are to provide low-gluten hosts, which contain a sufficient amount of gluten to obtain the confection of bread. Hosts which are completely gluten-free or are provided by an individual are invalid for the celebration of the Mass and may never be used.
- The lay faithful who are not able to receive Holy Communion at all under the species of bread, may receive Holy Communion under the species of wine only.
- Pastors have a grave moral obligation to ensure valid matter for both the hosts and the wine used at Mass.


