

#### SEARCHING FOR JESUS - A PRAYER FOR THE END OF CHRISTMAS TIME

## OUTREACH





The New Community Shelter is a positive place where people in need can find all the help to help themselves. In cooperation with others in our community, they give every person access to the many resources they need to overcome their hardships to include: education, counseling, resources and in-house services. The life circumstances that lead to homelessness are different for every individual, but; every individual's goal here remains the same; to achieve self-sufficiency through

self-empowerment. The New Community Shelter Meal Program is open to any child or adult in our area who is in need of a meal. The program is housed at the shelter in downtown Green Bay. Meals are served 365 days a year. Our parish sponsors dinner on the first Thursday of each month and feeds between 160-230 guests. Volunteers transport the food to the shelter and warm and serve the food. Pizza, salad, garlic bread, jello salads and desserts are served. #### House of Hope

House of Hope provides programming, services, and shelter to homeless youth and families. House of Hope's intensive case management program supports residents by focusing on: Safe and Stable Housing, Employment, Positive Parenting Skills, Financial Literacy and Debt Management, Nutrition & Meal Preparation, Formal Education Healthy Living Skills, Holistic Wellness

**Emergency Shelter:** Housing first shelter and support for families with children with a specialty in providing services for young parents ages 17-24 and their children of any age.

Housing Stability Program: Case management, housing search and placement, and financial assistance for families with children.

**Crossover:** Transitional housing with case management for families with children.

**Hope Center:** Shelter and supportive programming for unaccompanied, homeless youth ages 0-17. **Sustaining Hope:** Support offered to people served by House of Hope programming who return for case management, supportive connections, and resources to ensure they can remain stably housed.

On a monthly basis, our parish delivers various items to support this organization, such as laundry detergent, cleaning supplies, clothing, diapers and various household items.

Volunteer Opportunities Volunteers are needed to donate items, shop for items and deliver items. Time Commitment As little as 10 minutes to purchase or donate items or as much as one hour for delivery of the items to the House of Hope.
