

- PASTOR'S CORNER

There is a great mystery around the Priesthood and the Seminary because most Catholics do not see their priests very often, especially outside of the Sacraments. Only a few people know all that priests do or what goes into the preparation for being a priest. This is particularly true in modern times where the number of priests is dropping, and while seminary numbers are up from ten years ago, they are nothing compared to 30 or 40 years ago. Seminary is the time for us to study how to best serve those to whom we will be pastors, but this needs to go beyond theology and ethics classes. To understand how to best serve in parishes, we need to meet the people and see how parishes work today. This is the purpose of the teaching parish- to get seminarians practical experience with life in the parish and to learn how to minister to people best and most appropriately.


We at St. Francis de Sales Seminary receive a teaching parish when we enter theological studies. At this point, we have recently declared Candidacy to Holy Orders, which is a formal declaration and intention to conform one's life to priestly ministry. For most seminarians, this occurs after one to five years of seminary formation, and the seminarian has discerned that God is calling him to be a priest. It is not a guarantee that a candidate to Holy Orders will be ordained, but it is assumed that the man is actively conforming his life to that of a priest. This means that we study theology like a priest, pray like a priest, act as a priest, and minister as a priest. These dimensions of priestly formation do not stand alone. It would be detrimental to keep these aspects of a priestly life isolated. At a teaching parish, we incorporate our human formation, prayer life, and classroom studies tangibly in ministry to others.

Another benefit of a teaching parish is that it gets us outside of the seminary. The seminary is a good place to withdraw from the tumultuous world so that we have the space, time, and support to grow humanly, intellectually, spiritually, and pastorally. However, too much time at the Seminary creates a bubble that insulates us from the outside reality. The reality of the Seminary, both its blessings and its struggles, is different than what happens in parishes. The teaching parish reminds us of this fact and provides an opportunity to engage in the blessings and the struggles of parishioners.

Between what we learn in the field experience of the teaching parish and the classes in seminary, we pray that we can come to have hearts like Christ's, which allow us to walk alongside all those we encounter through their celebrations, tragedies, and all other occasions of life. It is such an honor and a joy to be able to meet total strangers and grow closer to them, especially through the births, marriages, and deaths in their families. As parish priests, our mission will be to walk with our parishioners on the path to Heaven where one day we can all enjoy the fruits of God's love and union with him. It is our hope that our studies at St. Francis de Sales and our time spent at St. Monica and St. Eugene will represent to us the first steps of our priestly journeys to Heaven, and we thank you for walking with us in this journey.


