

#### Looking to save taxes on your Required Minimum Distribution while helping St. Matthew?

If you have to take a required minimum distribution from your IRA because you are over age 72, you can donate some or all of your required minimum distribution to St. Matthew (and other charities) and avoid paying tax on that amount. Your broker or IRA custodian must send the money directly from your IRA to St. Matthew. (That is, you can't take the money out and write a check to St. Matthew later. It must be a direct transfer.) Check with your broker or IRA custodian for more information.

# A Message from Fr Ryan:

Next up in the Nicene Creed, we say, "For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate." Did you know that thirty percent of Catholics do not believe in a "personal" God? That is, they believe that God is merely a force or a presence – without a name, without real existence, without the ability to relate to us? To say the least, this is sad.

Fairy tales – stories about people that don't exist living in imaginary worlds – begin with "once upon a time" because the story isn't real. The point of a fairy tale isn't what happened but what we can learn from the story. The Gospel and the life of Jesus are entirely different. The Creed directs us to a particular event (the Cross) carried out by a particular man (Pontius Pilate). The "story" isn't invented and it isn't meant to teach a lesson. It is meant to introduce us to a God who is personal, who acts in our world, and who wants a relationship with you!

The Creed reminds us that God is not only "personal," be that he has acted personally within our history. Not content to simply engage us from outside of our universe, God himself came to us in our very flesh! This line of the Creed makes it very, very specific for those who need proof – it was at this moment in history, at this place, in this time, that God came to us!

# Is Christ Calling You To Become a Deacon?

God is calling on each of us to serve one another in charity and love. Some men are receiving a particular invitation from God to serve Christ and His Church in ordained ministry as Permanent Deacons.

Deacons have a unique identity as neither a lay person nor a priest. Through the sacramental grace of Holy Orders, deacons are conformed into the image of Christ the Servant. In communion with Bishop Siegel and his body of priests, deacons serve to build up the community of faith among God's people through Word, sacrament and especially works of charity.

Our diocesan permanent deacons have greatly enriched our diocese by offering their lives in service in many of our parishes, hospitals, correction facilities and nursing homes as well as through outreach ministries to the homeless, the poor and hungry and the lonely and through many other ministries of charity.
