### Baptisms

### Matrimony

Registered Parishioners should make arrangements with the priest of the parish as soon as you are seriously contemplating marriage - at least six months prior to the wedding. Weddings are strongly discouraged during Lent and Octave of Easter.

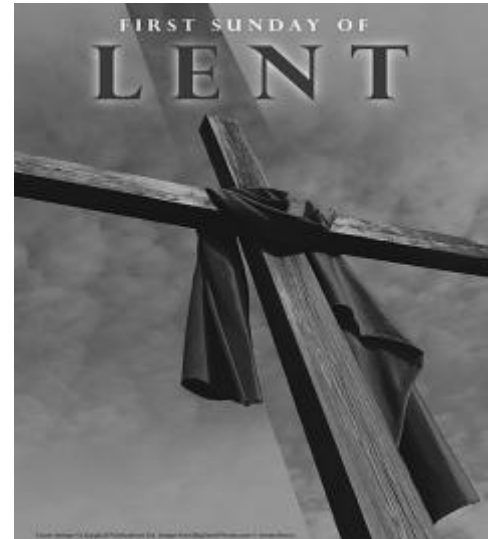

# - THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME -

## FR. BOB'S COLUMN

### FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT – THE ASHES ARE GONE. NOW WHAT?

*“Lent is a time for reflection and repentance, a time to pray with renewed fervor for ourselves, our families, and the Church. During this holy season let’s also pray for the transformation of the world we live in.*

*Through the grace of Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit, may we all be agents of the Father’s mercy!”*

from Archbishop Carlson.

That is the theory. Now some practical suggestions. The traditional Lenten activities which come from the gospels are prayer, fasting and almsgiving – pretty obvious and straightforward. But I came across from Our Sunday Visitor another approach called the 1-1-1 Plan: one sin, one add-on, and one give-up.

No, don’t add one more sin, but rather first focus on one sin or fault that you want to eliminate or lessen during Lent– something that really gets in the way of your relationship with God or with family and friends. Ask the Lord for the help of his grace to be freed of this one sin.

Secondly, add on one positive activity that will improve or deepen your spiritual life – weekday Mass, spiritual reading, reading of Sacred Scriptures, daily rosary, or get up early for 10 minutes of prayerful meditation every day during Lent, even if you are very busy or tired.

The third part of our 1-1-1 Plan – give up or deny yourself something you really like or are inordinately attached to. It could be a TV program, using social media too often, impulse purchases, fast food, expensive coffee, between-meal snacks, or .... Make the sacrifice to do without this for the 40 days of Lent – in solidarity with Jesus who fasted for 40 days in the desert.

Keep it simple this Lent – try the 1-1-1 Plan.



### CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES – TWO WAYS FOR LENTEN ALMSGIVING TO THE POOR AND HUNGRY!

If you don’t always feel comfortable giving a handout to a “beggar” or street person or the person at the highway ramp, take care of your Christian responsibility to help the poor by these two opportunities:

1. LENTEN RICE BOWL - Pick up a “rice bowl” at the church entrance to fill up with your daily offering to feed and support a few of the many needy people around the world and in our community who are served by CRS.
2. CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES ANNUAL COLLECTION – March 31<sup>st</sup> - Using the “second collection envelope” in your monthly packet, make a generous Lenten contribution to CRS which gives aid to victims of persecution and natural disaster, provides legal services to poor immigrants, and advocates for the powerless.
