FR. BOB'S COLUMN



LAST REGULAR SUNDAY OF LENT – TODAY

Today's readings invite us to reflect on our need for redemption from God, and to open our eyes to the new things that God wants to do in us. The first reading from Isaiah is addressed to the Jewish exiles in Babylon. The Lord says to not worry about the past (or the present situation). God is ready to do something great for his people – to save them and make everything new again back in their homeland.

Our Lord is ready to do something great for us – to save us from our old nagging sins, and sometimes great sins, by his death and resurrection. Just as the sinful woman in the gospel today is forgiven by Jesus and given another chance to be faithful; we too will get another chance to get it right in our love of God and love of others.

HOLY WEEK STARTS NEXT SUNDAY – PALM (PASSION) SUNDAY



Following the long tradition of Catholic liturgy for Palm Sunday, we will gather outside the front doors of church for all three weekend Masses

(pending the weather). The palms will be distributed and blessed with the reading of the gospel of Jesus' jubilant entry into Jerusalem, the holy city, just days before he is arrested. We process into church together and then the theme changes from Palms to the Passion account of Jesus' crucifixion.

THE CELEBRATION OF THE PASCHAL MYSTERY OF JESUS' PASSION, DEATH AND RESURRECTION!

HOLY THURSDAY, GOOD FRIDAY, AND THE EASTER VIGIL

Lent actually ends with the beginning of the Holy Thursday evening Mass at 7pm, where we commemorate the Last Supper (actually the First Eucharist), the washing of the feet, and Jesus' agony in the garden.

Good Friday is the most somber day of the liturgical year for Christians and we read the Passion from the Gospel of John, and with the Veneration of the Cross, we make Jesus' sacrifice of his life for us sinners by his suffering and death on the cross. This service is Friday evening at 7pm.

The climax and third part of the Sacred Three Days is the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday at 7pm. For this greatest of all the Catholic liturgical ceremonies, we start by gathering in church for readings and psalms from the Old Testament that set the stage for the celebration of the Lord's Resurrection. As it gets dark outside, we gather outside the front doors of the church for the lighting of the New Fire and Lighting of the Easter Candle, which then leads our joyous celebration back into church lit by our candles. →

April 25th 2019 – Meeting and entertainment

Doors to the Cornerstone school gym will open at 6:30. Our entertainment for the month of April is the Bishop DuBourg Swing Dancers who start performing promptly at 7PM. The highlights of this dance style are exciting aerials, tosses, spins and lifts. A short meeting and refreshments will follow.



At the last meeting it was voted to have another **community service project** supporting the Cornerstone School. At the April meeting we will be collecting 8 ½" x 11" copy paper (500 Sheets Per Ream), liquid hand soap, toilet tissue, paper towels and trash bags – in the 39 gallon size and 13 gallon size (tall kitchen bags). There will be a table set up to place your donations on upon your arrival.

Help a snake, a ferret, gerbil, guinea pig or one of the other 200 animals at the Children's zoo! At our meetings in April, and May we will be collecting empty pill containers (labels removed) and paperboard (from cereal boxes, tubes from paper towels, wrapping paper, toilet tissue, and egg cartons). The zoo staff is excited to have these "recyclables".

Our trips are open to both members and non-members of our club. Our next bus trip will be Tuesday June 4th. We're off to Herman Missouri with professional tour guide Linda Koenig.

We will visit the Hermann Farm Museum, offering a trip back in time to see how the first German immigrants lived and farmed after arriving in Hermann Valley in 1837. We will take a tram ride through the 200 acre farm and visit the Husmann House and outbuildings. Enjoy the chickens, sheep, cattle, mules, Shire draft horses and other animals along the ride. Lunch is provided at The Herman Wursthau. After lunch there are lots of good meat and specialty foods to sample and purchase, so bring a small cooler along if interested in taking some of these goodies home. In the afternoon we will visit the Hermanhoff Winery for included wine and cheese samples and a tour of their most interesting cellars. Sit on the patio and sip wines, or visit some of the downtown Herman shops and the ice cream parlor. **Deadline May 14th**, cost of the trip is \$83.00 MINIMAL WALKING The bus leaves St Bernadette's parking lot at 8:30 AM and returns at 4:30 PM.
