

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Gathering the people and opening our eyes is the connection between Jeremiah's words and Mark's Gospel passage today. Jeremiah reminds the Israelites that even though the Northern Kingdom has fallen to the Assyrians and the Babylonians are on the verge of taking over the rest of Israel, God is still with His people no matter the difficulties they continue to face. God will renew their spirits. Mark then leads us on the path from Jericho to Jerusalem (the Way of the Cross) when Jesus and His disciples encounter a



blind man, Bartimaeus, who hears the passing crowd and cries out to Jesus for help.
Bartimaeus wants, not only to see, but to experience the hope and saving grace that Jesus affords all of us.
Bartimaeus changes his way of living upon receiving his sight and followed Jesus. The path to follow in the Lord's

footsteps is made clear to all of us. Do we remove the blinders of a selfish life in our pursuit of the Truth, the Way of Life? Are we mindful of the opportunities to follow God, free of the blinding effects of our sins?

Remember that our **next meeting** is at 1pm in the gym on Thursday, October 28th. See you there! We'll be enjoying some horse races!


