Matrimony

Registered Parishioners should make arrangements with the priest of the parish as soon as you are seriously contemplating marriage - at least six months prior to the wedding. Weddings are strongly discouraged during Lent and Octave of Easter.

FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF OUR LORD

Today we have the second manifestation (epiphany) of Jesus in this Christmas season. Last week to the magi (gentiles); this week at the Jordan River with John the Baptist and many Jewish people. Jesus is more fully



revealed to us in today's gospel as a voice from heaven said, "You are my beloved Son; with whom I am well pleased." Clearly now we know the identity of this man who was born thirty years prior in Bethlehem and now is baptized by John and ready to start his saving ministry of teaching, healing, and ultimately giving his very life to be our Redeemer. On this last day of the Christmas season we could be thinking about how we will be open to Christ manifesting himself in our lives.

On this feast celebrating our Lord's Baptism, it would also be appropriate to remember our own baptism probably many years ago. Recall the church of your baptism; envision your parents and godparents bringing you to the priest to be baptized into God's family, the Church. Do you know the actual date of your baptism? In one way it is the most important day of your life. That was the day that Christ began to manifest himself to you, and he has continued every day of your life since then. Every day is an "epiphany" of the Lord in your life.

2022 Roe v. Wade Memorial Mass & Prayer Vigil Saturday, January 15, Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis

(in-person and live-streamed) Join the Respect Life Apostolate for the Archdiocese of St. Louis Roe v. Wade Memorial Mass celebrated by Archbishop Mitchell T. Rozanski on Saturday, January 15 at 10 a.m. at the Cathedral Basilica. Mass will



include the Pro-Life Generation Memorial and the Life-Line Coalition collection, which benefits thousands of local pregnant and parenting moms and families annually. The Rosary Procession to and from our state's last abortion facility follows Mass, which marks the 49th anniversary of the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision which legalized abortion on Jan. 22, 1973. The prayer vigil concludes with a reception and fellowship in Boland Hall.
