

Communion Calls



3RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – 'HOME-BOY' MAKES GOOD! OR DOES HE?

After Luke's formal introduction to his written Gospel, the lectionary skips ahead to Jesus visiting many synagogues in Galilee, and finally returning home to the synagogue in Nazareth, where he grew up with Joseph



and Mary. Jesus deliberately reads a passage from Isaiah the Prophet which refers to the Messiah, and then pauses for dramatic effect. Surprising everyone, Jesus

boldly proclaims that this well-known scripture refers to himself the hometown boy, now anointed by God the Father and ready to let the Spirit of God to work with him to bring about a jubilee year acceptable to the Lord. This is the long-awaited Messiah, Savior of the world, come to initiate the Kingdom of God on earth. Exciting but frightening for the hometown folks! After their initial enthusiasm for Jesus' presence, some of the crowd quickly turn against him and run him out of town. Was it jealousy or animosity on their part? Or was it just too hard to believe that God was working through one of their own -Joseph and Mary's son?

How is Jesus' message about God's plan exciting for us to know that Jesus is our Savior? How is it frightening in what he expects of us?

Jesus in the Gospel today proclaimed "a year acceptable to the Lord." 
