

DIVINE MERCY DIOCESAN SHRINE

Join us Sunday, June 11 at 12:30 p.m. at the Cathedral for the opening of the Divine Mercy Diocesan Shrine beginning with a Bilingual Mass celebrated by Bishop Anthony Taylor. Blessed Sacrament will be exposed after Communion and a procession will begin from the Cathedral to St. Edwards. Bishop Taylor will blessed the new image of the Divine Mercy and pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet followed by the official signing of the Decree of Creating a Diocesan Shrine, concluding with benediction. A light reception will follow outside St. Edward's parish grounds. Everyone is invited to attend.





As we approach Holy Week and Easter, I thought I would give the parish an update about the music. Holy Week and Easter is my favorite week of the year; and the Choir is singing some excellent

music. Palm Sunday, the choir is singing an anthem by Philip Moore "It is a Thing Most Wonderful" as well as a newish setting of the traditional Latin text "Nolo Mortem Peccatoris" by composer Elizabeth Atkinson. Familiar hymns such as "All Glory Laud and Honor" and "O Sacred Head Surrounded" will be sung as well. For the Chrism Mass, the Choir will be joined by the Pinnacle Brass Quintet. Anthems for this Mass are the iconic setting of "Salvator Mundi" by Thomas Tallis, and "O Cruz Fiel (Faithful cross)" by American Composer Leo Nestor. Guest organist Dr. Colin MacKnight will play J.S. Bach's rousing Prelude and Fugue in B Minor for the postlude. For Holy Thursday, the choir is singing "Ubi Caritas" by Maurice Durufle as well as a setting of "Ave Verum" by Belgian Composer Flor Peeters. Good Friday, the organ will be completely silenced and the choir will sing a setting of the Reproaches as well as "Were You There". The Easter Vigil, the choir will join with the Pinnacle Brass and sing Palestrina's beautiful setting of "Regina Caeli" as well as a new piece by Canadian composer Stephanie Martin called "Now the Queen of Seasons". Rosemarie Ochoa, assistant organist, will play the festive "Carillon de Westminster" by Louis Vierne as the postlude for this Mass. New for this year, the choir and the Pinnacle Brass will sing and play for both the 8:30 a.m. and 12:05 Noon Masses on Easter Sunday. The choir will sing "Christ Our Passover" by American Composer Richard Dirksen and "Regina Caeli" for this Mass as well as the beloved hymn "Jesus Christ is Risen Today". Please join us for the Holy Week and Easter Masses. I hope that the music will deepen your prayer and give you joy in the greatest week of the Church's year. ~ Beau Baldwin

the atriums. When God calls you to serve, how will you answer? We need you!


