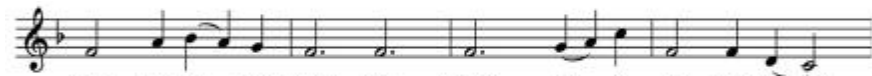

Communion
