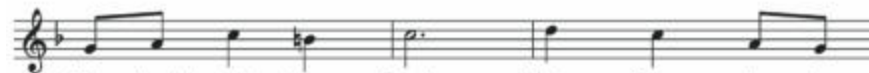

Communion
