





Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Happy Feast of Jesus' Baptism....by St. John the Baptist! Our parish is blessed with another big story in the Gospel being connected to our namesake. As I mentioned last week Jesus does not of course need to be baptized, but He does so to enable us to enter into His life and receive His grace by raising baptism to a sacrament. It becomes our entrance into His life. Did you know that anyone can baptize if they have the right intention. If there is an emergency where the person is in danger of dying, you do not need to wait for a member of the clergy. If the person is desiring baptism, anyone present can get some water and pour it over their head three times while saying the formula, "I baptize you, NAME, in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Then make it a point to inform the church in those boundaries. There are even cases of Jewish nurses who have helped baptize Catholic infants, because while they personally did not have the faith of the mother, they knew it was the desire of the mother and it was an emergency that could not wait. They had the right intention, and the church was blessed through them. Christ underwent this great act of humility for us, and the Kingdom of God has grown from the size of a mustard seed into a mighty tree.

This week we pass into Ordinary Time, and the stories from the full-time ministry of Jesus Christ. In these pages of Scripture we run into healings, exorcisms, resurrections, and wisdom from the Word made Flesh...there is nothing simply "ordinary" about it. This time in the calendar simply bears the name ordinary because it is "ordered" according to these numbered weeks between Christmas and Lent and then Easter and Advent.

One of the up and coming events that is starting to get close now is the Ribbon Cutting Mass with Archbishop Rozanski when he will bless our new addition. This parish has really pitched in to make the project take off, and all are invited to the 5:30 pm Mass on January 29th and the reception to follow in the Parish Hall. More to follow on the food....but put it on your calendar regardless of the physical fare – for the Holy Spirit is serving us the main course!

The Knights of Columbus are slated to have their first Fifth Sunday Breakfast on January 30th in quite a long time. Please come out and support their effort. Stay tuned for Dinner Auction news. That event is scheduled for Feb 26th. And if you missed the Poland Pilgrimage Meeting at St. John's – there are two scheduled for January 30th: Holy Infant at 1 pm and ICD at 3 pm.

In the Two Year Bible – Reading Schedule that we have been printing we have entered into the Book of Proverbs and the Book of The Acts of the Apostles. Proverbs is a book composed by a few different authors, but the lion share of it has always been attributed to King Solomon writing in the 10th century B.C. Scott Hahn, a Biblical commentator writes, "the majority of the sayings in Proverbs resemble pearls strung together on a necklace: each has a message that is beautiful and valuable in its own right, yet each is more or less independent of those that precede and follow." Solomon writes the first few chapters as if he is writing as a father to a son. They instruct us to pursue and to love wisdom and to avoid the seduction of a life of pleasure and those who would lead us down that path. This would be excellent reading for those who are feeling the lure of the passions from young adulthood through the end of life. The virtuous life is also described in a way that seeks to not only keep us from lust, but that can lead us into fruitful relationships. Ultimately, the foundational motif is "the fear of the Lord."

The wisdom granted to Solomon is from God and is aimed at drawing those searching for righteousness back to Him. Wisdom begins with revering the Lord. Those who follow the way of wisdom lead a life of prayer, they trust in the Lord, work diligently, practice humility, receive correction from others, remain committed to honesty, are compassionate for the poor, and dutifully instruct their children. The young male part of the audience is taught to seek a good and prudent wife and avoid promiscuous women and pride. This last advice could be applied to both genders in avoiding both promiscuous women and men, and both male and female would do well to appreciate the value of marriage in a world that does not know its worth. Please take up and read and grow in likeness to not only Solomon, but the very Embodiment of all Wisdom: Jesus Christ.


