



40 Hours Eucharistic Adoration

an opportunity to put Christ in the center of our Christmas preparations and to pray for the Church and our country St. Paul the Apostle Catholic Church

We would like to do a 40 Hours Devotion of Eucharistic Adoration at St. Paul's from

7:00 p.m. December 2 (after First Friday Mass) and concluding on Sunday afternoon, December 4, at 3:00 p.m. with Solemn Benediction.

Forty Hours Devotion is a period of continuous adoration where the faithful can spend time with Our Lord present in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar. Solemn exposition of a consecrated host in the monstrance will be on the altar for the duration of the adoration period. It is forty hours long since that is the amount of time Jesus spent in the tomb between His death and resurrection.

In the past, popes and bishops have called for 40 Hours Eucharistic Adoration in times of crisis. With the current troubles we see happening and the spiritual warfare being waged upon us, the Church, the family, and our country, we are called to draw closer to Christ for strength and help in these struggles. Spending time with Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist is one major way we can help ourselves and others through prayer and sacrifice.

We will need volunteers to commit to one hour time slots for the duration of this devotion. There will be sign-up sheets in the narthex after the Masses on the weekends of November 19-20 and November 26-27. The Catholic Church has five precepts. The obligatory character of these positive laws is meant to guarantee to the faithful the very necessary minimum in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor

The five Precepts of the Church are:

- 1) Catholics attend Mass on Sundays (or the vigil on Saturday evenings) and holy days of obligation.
- 2) Catholics confess our sins at least once a year through the sacrament of reconciliation
- 3) Catholics receive our Creator in Holy Communion at least once during the Easter season
- 4) Catholics observe the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence. We fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. We abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent, and do some penance each Friday of the year.
- 5) Catholics provide for the material needs of the Church, each according to his/her ability.
