

FAITH FORMATION



The Catholic Church has five precepts. The obligatory character of these positive laws is meant to guarantee to the faithful the very necessary minimum in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor

The five Precepts of the Church are:

- 1) Catholics attend Mass on Sundays (or the vigil on Saturday evenings) and holy days of obligation.
- 2) Catholics confess our sins at least once a year through the sacrament of reconciliation
- 3) Catholics receive our Creator in Holy
- Communion at least once during the Easter season
- 4) Catholics observe the prescribed days of
- fasting and abstinence. We fast on Ash

Wednesday and Good Friday. We abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent, and do some penance each Friday of the year.

5) Ćatholics provide for the material needs of the Church, each according to his/her ability.
