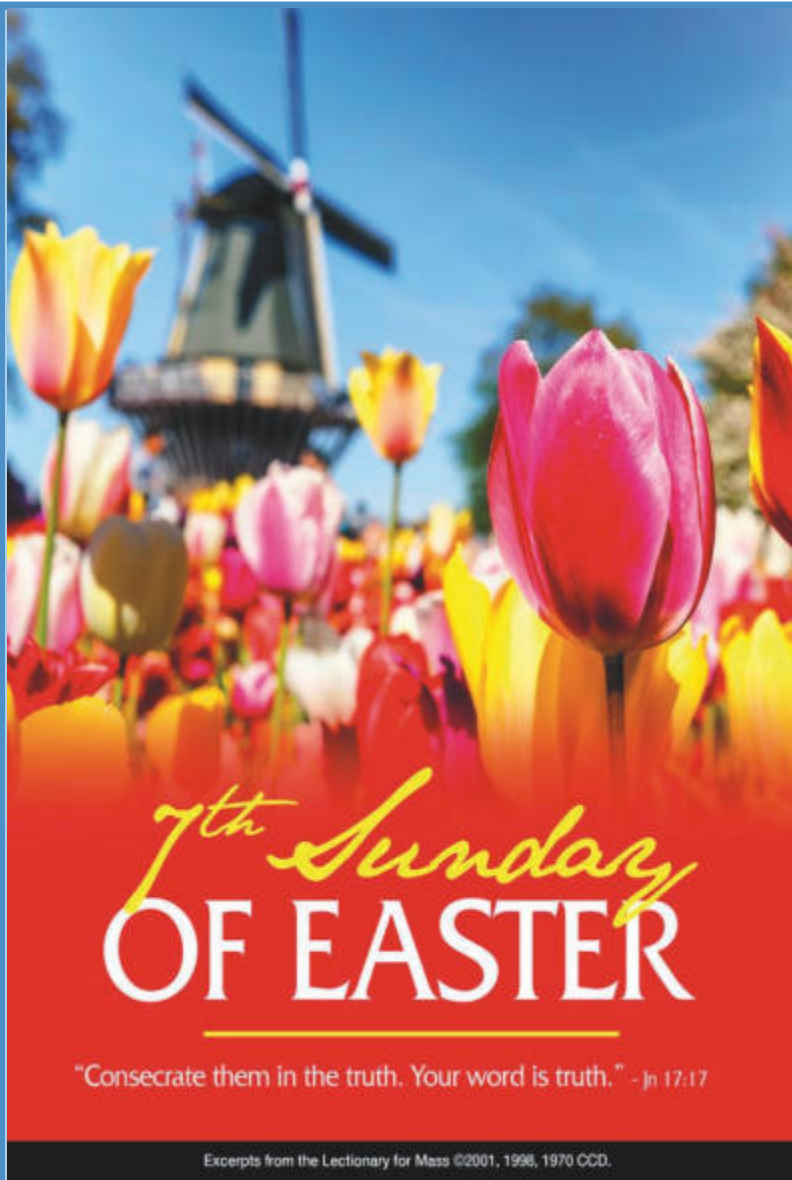

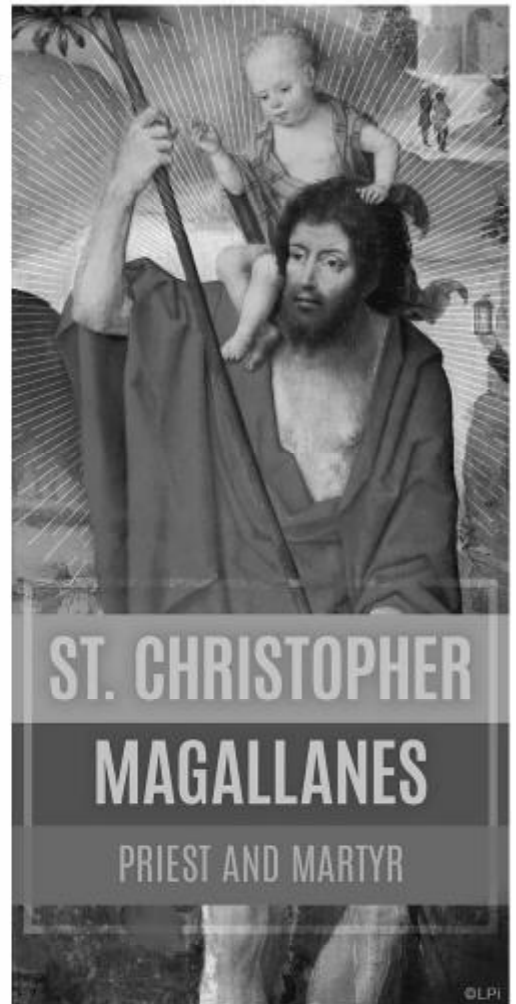

How To Go To Confession


Prior to going into the confessional, each penitent should make a good examination of conscience. A good review of the Ten Commandments is helpful: I) I am the Lord your God. You shall not have strange gods before Me. II) You shall not take the name of the Lord, your God, in vain. III) Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day. IV) Honor your father and your mother. V) You shall not kill. VI) You shall not commit adultery. VII) You shall not steal. VIII) You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. XI) You shall not covet your neighbor's wife. X) You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

When you enter the confessional, sit or kneel down and begin "**Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been (how many weeks, months, years?) since my last confession. These are my sins.**" You then tell the priest your sins, making special mention of any mortal sins you have committed. So he'll know when you're finished, you conclude with "**For these and all my sins I am truly sorry.**" The priest will give you a few words of encouragement and /or advice, and your penance, and then he will invite you to say the Act of Contrition. When you are finished, he will give you absolution. You should make the Sign of the Cross when he gets to the part that says. "I absolve you from your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." There—you've done it! It's as simple and as wonderful as that!

Act of Contrition:

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended Thee, and I detest all my sins because of Thy just punishments. But most of all because they have offended Thee, my God, who art all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve with the help of Thy grace to confess my sins, do penance, and amend my life. Amen.

O my God, I am sorry for my sins. In choosing to sin and failing to do good I have sinned against you and your Church. I firmly intend, with the help of you Son, to make up for my sins and to love as I should. Our Savior, Jesus Christ, suffered and died for us. In His name, my God, have mercy.
