

The Holy Family

Hello, Merry Christmas, and Happy Feast of the Holy Family!

Christmas is such an important Feast that we celebrate it not only for a day but for eight days, what is properly called an "Octave."

The Octave of Christmas concludes on January 1st, which is the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God. Typically, this is a Holy Day of Obligation but, since it falls on a Saturday, it is not a Day of Obligation this year. That said, it is still very much a day worth celebrating.

We will celebrate Holy Mass for Mary, the Mother of God, on Friday, December 31^{st} at 5:00pm and on Saturday, January 1^{st} at 8:00am. The Saturday Mass will be our typical First Saturday Traditional Latin Mass and, if you are not familiar with this form of the Mass, there are guides to help you follow and pray along.

Today- the Sunday within the Octave of Christmas- we celebrate the particular Feast of the Holy Family. The Holy Family is the name given to the family unit of Jesus, the Divine Son of God, His mother the Virgin Mary, and His foster-father Joseph. We know very little about the life of the Holy Family through the Gospels, but they do speak of the early years of the Holy Family, including the Birth of Jesus in Bethlehem, the flight into Egypt, and the finding of Jesus in the Temple. While the exact details of the day-to-day life of the Holy Family may be unknown, we can still learn a lot from the stories we do have.

The Feast of the Holy Family is not just about the Holy Family, but about our own families too. Family life is absolutely central to our Faith, and the main purpose of this Feast is to present the Holy Family as the model for all Christian families, and for domestic life in general. Our family life becomes sanctified when we live the life of the Church within our homes. This is called the "domestic church" or the "church in miniature." St. John Chrysostom urged all Christians to make each home a "family church" and, in doing so, we sanctify the family unit.

Just how does one live out the Church in the family? The best way is by making Christ the center of family and individual life. Ways to do this include: reading Sacred Scripture regularly, praying daily, attending Mass at least on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, imitating the actions of the Holy Family, going to Confession frequently, and so forth, all done as a family unit held together by the love of God.

The Holy Family feast is a good time to remember the importance of the family and pray for our human and spiritual families. Blessings and prayers to you and your family!

DEACON'S CORNER

Q. Deacon Mike, during my studies, I came across something called the Arian heresy. I understand that it was widespread in the early church years. Can you tell me something about it?

A. Arius was born in 256 AD and was ordained a Catholic priest in 313 AD. In 318 AD, Arius heard a discourse on the doctrine of the Trinity by the Patriarch of Alexandria and disagreed with his interpretation. Arius stated that the Patriarch had fallen into error and proceeded to set out his own ideas of the Trinity. Arius denied that Christ was really the Eternal Son of God and that Jesus was not co-equal in sharing the Divine Nature. According to him, the Person of Christ existed before all other created things and was nobler than them all. But, he also said, God <u>created</u> the Person of Christ in eternity and through Him created all other things in time. Later, the <u>created</u> Christ became man for the redemption of the human race. In 320 AD, a second synod of Alexandria condemned this doctrine as heretical because it made the eternal Son of God a mere creature, denying that He was equally uncreated along with the Father and the Holy Spirit. Arius would not submit and continued teaching and publicly spreading his errors. He had many followers and caused an immense disturbance, both in the Church and in the public forum. Finally, Emperor Constantine demanded that a council be called to finally decide the issue. In 325 AD, the bishops met in Nicaea and, again, condemned the teachings of Arius. He, again, would not submit to the authority of the Church and was excommunicated. His heresy has led multitudes astray over the centuries and still does today.
