

The Baptism of our Lord

Happy Feast of the Baptism of the Lord!
First, a huge "Thank You!" to all who contributed to the
Church Christmas Wish List. We received sufficient
donations to purchase the new monstrance, and it may be in
use as early as this Tuesday for Eucharistic Adoration!
Second, a word about the upcoming transition in Liturgical
seasons.

Today's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord officially concludes the Christmas Season and returns us to Ordinary Time.

In English, the word "ordinary" typically conveys a sense that little or nothing of great importance is happening...but nothing could be further from the truth. The entire purpose of the season of "Ordinary Time" is to strive anew to turn from sin and grow in holiness, becoming better each and every day. This growth is far from ordinary. In fact, it is extraordinary insofar as we need God's grace and life within us in order for this growth to occur! The spiritual growth that we seek during Ordinary Time is conveyed by the liturgical colour of green that is used throughout this season. Green is associated with life and growth: the vegetative life of trees, plants, and grass, radiates a beautiful green colour when healthy and vibrant. Taking this cue from nature, the liturgy designates green for use during Ordinary Time to teach us that this is a season for focused growth in our spiritual life. For each of us, our Baptism was the moment when we began our spiritual life, but this life is meant to grow stronger until the moment of our death. This is what it means to grow in holiness, and it is a full-time job! The readings at Holy Mass during Ordinary Time focus on various aspects of living the Catholic Faith: prayer, virtues, love of God and neighbor, turning from sin, etc. We are challenged to do our best to heed these directions and put them into practice in our life, because these provide the nourishment we need to grow in holiness and become spiritually vibrant.

During this season, I encourage you to focus on one or two aspects of your life and strive to grow especially in those areas.

It could be: prayer, attending Holy Mass or Confession more frequently, turning from a specific sin and growing in a specific virtue, seeking to strengthen relationships in your life, trying to serve others in need, or any other number of things. All aspects of our life are open to God's work and His grace, and strengthening any of these aspects strengthens the whole as well.

Let's also be sure to pray for one another so that this season of Ordinary Time becomes a time of extraordinary spiritual growth for us as individuals, as a parish, and for the entire Body of Christ.

For the final time, Merry Christmas!

DEACON'S CORNER

- Q. Deacon Mike, do you think that a priest would think less of a penitent after hearing his/her confession?
- A. Absolutely not. The sacrament of confession is a most impersonal thing. A priest may be very friendly towards someone but, should this person ask the priest to hear his/her confession, the relationship changes completely. The priest is no longer their personal friend for the purpose of confession. To the priest, this person is now just a soul looking for spiritual advice and absolution. The priest is like a surgeon who concentrates on the physical troubles of a patient, except that, in the confessional, the priest is concentrating on the penitent's <u>spiritual</u> troubles. The moment that the words of absolution are spoken, the priest dismisses any and all thoughts of what he has just heard in the confessional. If the priest sees that person five minutes after his/her confession, it's like the priest never had heard the confession at all. Priests are no more 'shocked' at hearing someone's confession of their sins than they would be at hearing about the same person's physical problems. At the end of the confession, everything that the priest has heard is consigned to that oblivion in which every other confession lies buried and forgotten.
