

# 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Hello and Blessed Second Sunday of Ordinary Time! This week, I will be away on Thursday and Friday joining hundreds of thousands at the March for Life in Washington, DC. This year marks the forty-ninth anniversary of the Supreme Court's tragic Roe v. Wade decision, which created a right to legalized abortion in the United States of America. Since that decision, over 65 million children have been legally killed before birth. To put that number in perspective, abortions in the United States occur at a rate of one abortion about every twenty seconds, and the total number of all of those who have died in the United States due to COVID-19 is less than half the number of lives aborted this past year alone.

The tragedy of abortion cannot be overstated. In addition to the loss of innocent life, the life-long effect upon the mothers and fathers of these children is often devastating and, from the perspective of Faith, we know that the sin of abortion endangers the eternal salvation of all those involved: parents, doctors, nurses, employees, and all who in any way facilitate or promote abortion.

For all of these reasons, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has repeatedly said that abortion is the "preeminent moral issue of our time." This is not to deny the importance of other moral issues but simply to recognize that in gravity and in scope, nothing compares to the evil of abortion.

In light of this, I would encourage each of us to pray every day for an end to abortion, conversion for those who promote it, and healing for those harmed by it. It could be as simple as an extra "Hail, Mary" or "Memorare." In particular, this upcoming Saturday- January 22<sup>nd</sup>- is designated as a day of Penance and Prayer for the Sanctity of Human Life, so I hope that day we will each make a particular sacrifice and offer our prayers so that the dignity of all human life will be respected. We can pray in particular this year for our Supreme Court justices, who are currently preparing a decision that could go as far as overturn *Roe v. Wade*.

I would also encourage you to consider donating to organizations that work to end abortion and care for mothers in difficult situations. Locally, organizations such as Coalition for Life, Birthright, Defenders of the Unborn, Thrive, and Our Lady's Inn all do very important and often unnoticed work in this arena. They are always in need of donations, both monetary and supplies, as well as volunteers.

Finally, if you or someone you know has been affected by abortion, please know that there is healing and hope available. This comes spiritually in the Sacrament of Confession, where no sin is too great for God to forgive. It also comes in counseling and support, especially through organizations such as Project Rachel and Project Joseph. Please do not hesitate to reach out.

I truly believe that our faithful prayer and action will bring about a culture in our nation that fully respects all human life from conception until natural death.

#### DEACON'S CORNER

Q. Did God create the devil or is the devil eternal, like God?

A. Only God is eternal. Everything and everyone else has been created. God did not create the devil as a devil. In other words, God did not create any being, whether spiritual or corporal, as evil. The angels are beings of a spiritual nature, endowed with intelligence and free will, just like human beings are. As created, they were entirely good. But, some angels misused their freedom of will and rendered themselves evil by their opposition to God, who is goodness itself. Evil is always opposed to good and anyone who is opposed to God is opposed to good. God is not the cause of evil. He gave the angels (and us) freedom of will so that we might offer Him, not a compulsory love but a love of free choice. In other words, God does not force us to love Him—He allows us to love Him. God does not want us to misuse our gift of freedom but He knows that some of us, including the "fallen" angels, will choose to turn away from Him and follow the devil. If God forbids sin, how could He be the cause of it? The devil chose to turn away from God and was responsible for his own choice and so is anyone else (of sound mind).
