Thank you, again, to all who contributed to the "Church Christmas Wish List" for the purchase of a new monstrance. This past Tuesday for Eucharistic Adoration the monstrance was used for the first time! Stop in to Church any Tuesday from 9:00am-7:00pm to see it...and to pray before our Lord in Adoration!

Whether you are praying in Church or elsewhere, please pray for all of those preparing to enter the Catholic Church this upcoming Easter. We currently have five persons preparing to become Catholic! Pray especially for their growth in Faith and perseverance.

Next weekend we will be celebrating the Solemnity of St. Bridget of Kildare, our parish patroness. Her Feast Day is February 1st, but we are permitted to move the celebration to the closest Sunday so that more persons are able to participate.

Finally, we are in the midst of the annual subscription campaign for the *St. Louis Review*, our Archdiocesan Catholic newspaper. A one year subscription is \$35 and includes both the printed copy mailed to your home weekly as well as digital access to all of the *Review* content.

There is an envelope in the January packet of contribution envelopes designated for subscribing to the *Review*. If you give electronically, there is an option there as well.

The Archdiocese asks us to provide a copy of the *St. Louis Review* to each household in our parish. We ask that, as much as possible, you might pay for your subscription. It currently costs our parish over \$8,000 annually to provide the *Review* to our parishioners, so if you are able to pay the \$35 subscription fee, or if you are not reading the *Review* regularly and would be okay discontinuing your subscription, it would be a tremendous help to the parish.

That said, if you would like to receive the *St. Louis Review*, but truly find the cost a hardship, we will gladly provide it for you. Just let us know.

DEACON'S CORNER

Q. Deacon Mike, my cousin in New York told me that she wants to go to Mass at a different parish than her own because her pastor puts her to sleep when he preaches. The pastor (and the deacon) at a neighboring parish really keep her interested in the homily when they preach. Can (and should) she do this?

A. This presents an interesting problem. To begin, it's good that your cousin has found a parish where she can be fed both from the Liturgy of the Eucharist and from the Liturgy of the Word. Too often, we make the mistake of thinking that Mass is only about the Eucharist. Holy Mass has two major parts: the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. They both require our full attention and reverence. But, many times some Catholics tend to neglect the Liturgy of the Word (which includes the homily) by doing things like reading the bulletin or coming in late or just not paying attention in general. In addition, to look at the other side, some lectors and preachers are either unprepared or ill-prepared to proclaim the Word of God. Some homilies aren't even based on the day's readings. So, some people just 'turn them off'. Another concern is that some people come to Mass just to get their 'cards punched' and don't actively and consciously participate. Too many of us just go through the motions. Pope John Paul II wrote several documents about the need for excellent preaching in order to feed the people. My first suggestion for your cousin would be to (tactfully) go to her local pastor and discuss the situation with him. There are numerous sources where he could go for some help in preparing and delivering his homilies. Secondly, if the first suggestion doesn't work, I would recommend that your cousin go where she can be excited about our precious faith. After all, our faith is much more important than geography.
