The Most Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

From the Pastor's Keyboard:

Merry Christmas! Our Holy Family Sunday bulletin is serving double duty this year as a Christmas bulletin, as Christmas is on a Saturday, and as a Sunday bulletin. So if you are reading this during the Christmas sermon, consider this a friendly reminder that tomorrow is Sunday, and Catholics are obligated to attend Sunday Mass. If you are reading this on Sunday during the sermon, good job coming back on Sunday! Reading the bulletin during the sermon might not be a bad choice as this column is being written by a less tired version of me than the one preaching on Sunday.

During Advent, I offered some short reflections of the Jewish roots of Christianity. As we spiritually make a pilgrimage to the stable in Bethlehem, we can consider the town itself. Bethlehem is not far from Jerusalem, but is a distinct town. In the time of Jesus, it would have been very small. The city is at the top of a hill or rather spread out over a few steep hills. The actual stable in Bethlehem is really a cave. The actual spot where Jesus was born is under the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem. It is marked with a little glass window to the rock floor below the stone floor. The words "here the Word became flesh" in Latin adorns the spot.

The bedrock is soft and the area is full of caves. Most every home would have been built over a cave or even into the rock. It is a perfect place for tending sheep. King David himself tended sheep on the hills of the area. The shepherds would keep their sheep in caves or clefts in the rock.

The cave where Jesus was born is part of a network of caves. Tour groups can even have Mass in the attached caves. At the time, stables were often attached to houses. Jesus's stable was likely the back end of someone's basement, with access to the cellar of the house and a little entrance to the outside for the animals. The actual spot for Jesus was tiny compared to the other rooms. It was definitely not the best spot in the house. In places that didn't have caves, as in the homes of the poor, the animals would sleep on the first floor and the people would sleep on the second floor loft.

Today is the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. The house of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph was in Nazareth. The location of the house is marked by the impressive Church of the Annunciation. Like Bethlehem, Nazareth has caves and homes with deep foundations. Currently, if you want to see the little house where Jesus grew up in, you would have to go two different places. The basement is located in Nazareth. The Church of the Annunciation has a big hole in the floor opening to the lower level where the little basement of Jesus's childhood home can be found, under the foundations of a destroyed older church.

The top half of the Holy House is in Loretto, Italy. In the Middle Ages, it was moved by the Angelo family to protect it from wars. The dimensions match between both halves of the house. These physical places, even though they have now been adorned with marble, remind us of the humble and very concrete beginnings of Jesus's ministry.
