FROM THE PASTOR'S KEYBOARD:

I recently listened to the audiobook of Dorothy Day's autobiography, "The Long Loneliness." Dorothy Day was a radical, agnostic journalist, who converted to Catholicism and became an even more profound radical as the cofounder of the Catholic Worker Movement. Her cause for sainthood has recently been forwarded to Rome for consideration.

One of many things that struck me as I listened to the book was that her conversion was sparked by the happiness she found in life. The Marxists, and she was friends with many of America's prominent Marxists at the time, would say religion is "the opiate of the people." She would remind herself of this as she found herself praying. But as she reflected, she found she was not praying because she needed an opiate, a painkiller. She prayed because she was happy.

She found her conversion while living in a commonlaw marriage arraignment with a man she truly loved, but who was always clear that they would never be married, and that he would tolerate no discussion of religion. Her partner helped her find joy in life. She loved him, spiritually and physically. He broke her out of her stupor and showed her the beauty of creation. Her "living in sin," and the "out of wed-lock" birth of her daughter, brought her joy, that led her to look to God! While repentance brought her to God in the past, it was joy that made her "do something definite." Dorothy Day was eventually baptized, but the stress and sorrow of leaving her lover and her radical friends was so severe, she had to go to several doctors.

When climbing a mountain, it is hard to measure the height of the surrounding mountains. Often, the mountain you are half-way up appears to be the tallest mountain. Christ promises "the fullness of joy" to those who keep his commands. That doesn't mean pleasure or even joy can't be found away from or ignoring some of those commands. But those are all false summits, joys that are real, but incomplete. When we feel contented in this life, from this summit, climbed so carefully, beyond another valley through the fog, we can sometimes see another higher mountain to climb with far greater joys to offer.


